### TWO UMPIRES HAVE LONG RECORD

Bob Emalle and Tom Connolly Nuzologized for Service on Diamond

NEW YORK, April 17.—No finer monument to the efforts of an integrity of a baseball umpire can be found than a record of more than a quarter of a century of service in the major leagues.

The really great umpire is born with the characteristics necessary to achieve success in his calling. It can be truthfully stated here that men who make up the staffs of the National and American Leagues are men of that caliber.

There are two veteran arbiters in the big league today, however, whose records stand out particularly brightly, and whose long years of continuous service entitle them to special mention as the 1920 season gets under way.

These men are the deans of umpiring staffs of the two big leagues—Robert Emalle of the National, and Thomas Connolly of the American.

Emalle will enter upon his thirtieth year as a judge of play in the senior major this month. Connolly will begin his twenty-seventh season as an umpire. He has handled the intricate duties of the American League since 1903, and previously was a National League umpire.

Hardly the bird who wrote "The Umpire" is a man who has not been a record of such veterans as these. It might better have written:

"The umpire is a man who has seen a member of the arbitral class. Who goes upon his lonely way un-sung. A target for the plainer and the fan. Yet none can say this title man is true."

Is it other than a judge both tried and true? His calling is a thankless one at best. And 'he' why, he's a hero through and through!

The umpire must have the bearing and balance that command respect. He must have the magnetic power to handle men who may not be possessed of the best of character. He must have a cool head, a slow temper and must know the laws of the game inside out. Such men are Bob Emalle and Tom Connolly.

Bob Emalle has been umpiring in the National League since 1911. He is the oldest umpire in the game in point of age and was the youngest member of the most competent who has ever handled an indicator. Four years ago he was the National League's premier umpire with a banquet in celebration of his twenty-fifth anniversary as a judge of play in the national circuit.

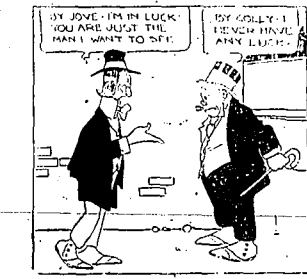
