#### TAX ON CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS

One of the most appealing plans for limiting the size of campaign contributions is that proposed by Senator Thomas offered as an amendment to the pending dyestuffs bill. Instead of establishing an arbitrary limit, it levies a federal tax of 100 per cent on all political donations in excess of \$1000, whether given by an individual, firm, an association or a corporation. Such expenditure would have to be itemized in connection with the income tax return, and would be subject to publication. The law would apply alike to pre-conven-

be sulffect to publication. The law would apply alike to pre-convention compaigns and election compaigns.

This may seem drawlie, when compared with the old regime. And yet it is reasonable enough. It wants amount, prostreadly, to piaceing a limit of 8000 on compaign gifts. That, as most citizens will agree, is about as much as anybody ought to pay to influence mybody clac's election. If a campaign is to cost \$1,000,000, it is better to get the amount from 1000 people, or 10,000 people, than to have a few very wealthy men contributing all of it.
