

It was found that outside reports of land prices and farmers' profils were greatly exaggerated. It has been said that land "for-fittedly selling at \$50 an'acre' has gone up to \$500 or more an aero, with the farmers remping a profit on their products sufficient to make good this "inflated capitalization." The federal investigators find that land has not sold near \$30 an aere for 30 years; that the average selling prices of good lova farm land now is not more than \$250 to \$775 an aere; that the profits of speculation have been made mostly by eity people; and that as a general proposition, the higher values merely mean higher taxes for the farmer to pay.

The average net income of a large number of lowa farmers for 1018, which was "good year", was \$34,89. Allowing 5 per cent for interest on the investment in land and equipment a prices prevailing before the recent speculative boom, the Department finds that the

LITERACY TEST IMPRACTICAL

The literacy test for aliens seeking admittance to this country has been weighed in the bahance and found wanting.
