

NEW YORK, April 23.—Colonel T. L. T. Clegg, general manager of the Yankees, believes his present race for the American League pennant will be the best in the history of the organization.

"I look for a pennant race that will be talked about in future years," said the Colonel. "From the looks of things, they're not bad, but I believe the break clubs in the league and it will not surprise me if we see three or even four clubs in a pack and neck down the home stretch."

"Some of the teams that were rated weak by the experts prior to the opening of the season are showing signs of improvement. It's too early in the season to make comparisons. We'll know more about the real strength of the various teams after we have all met at least one time."

"Col. Ruppert and myself are pleased with the Yankees. The new rules are not bad, but I don't think a slow start is discouraging. The boys simply are not hitting. I think we've got the talent necessary, for a winning team. It has not been generally known."

"Yes. Babe Ruth is going to help us a lot. It was unfortunate that he has not fallen in love with any changes in the pitching as a result of the new rules."

"Hitting may increase to some extent, but I don't believe the pitchers will be handicapped by the new rules once they get used to them."

## Newspapers Agree Not To Enlarge As Paper Is Scarce

NEW YORK, April 23.—Newspaper publishers affiliated with the American Newspaper Publishers Association have voted to support a resolution of their association to immediately adopt a resolution pledging the members not to use any more paper than is necessary in 1920, it was announced yesterday. Under the terms of this resolution: it is practically assured that the number of newspapers generally will remain stationary or become smaller in 1920.

Other resolutions bearing on the newspaper situation were adopted. Among them:

—An endorsement of the plan to extend existing wood pulp lands and rebuilding forest lands.

—A call upon the federal government to decrease waste of paper in governmental departments.

—An endorsement of the underwriters' plan to ban the embargoes on wood pulp from Canada.

The convention also went on record as opposing the postal rate on second class mail.

A resolution urging the utilization of all the water power resources of the nation was unanimously adopted, as well as a resolution against the "syndicalist" tactics of many employers and employees in trying to raise the prices of their products.

CHICAGO, April 23.—Canada is expected to be a neighborly attitude in refusing to help wood pulp into the United States, it was told yesterday by Dr. Hugh P. Baker, of the American paper and pulp association. An ad hoc committee of the association, delegates to the American paper and pulp conference, recommended that the Canadian government should be asked to nationalize its paper and pulp industry.

Much of today's search of the country was spent in consideration of the paper shortage. According to Dr. Baker's statement, newsprint consumption has increased from three pounds per capita in 1880 to 35 pounds in 1919.

The sentiment among the lumber men generally was that the government should establish a national forest service of conservation and care for trees, timbering wood pulp.

WASHINGTON, April 23.—The regular caucus on soldiers' pension legislation, which had been postponed until Friday, April 30, at the request of those Republican members of the House who called the caucus, was held at the door of the James Hotel.

## SOBER STRIKES

It is interesting to note that all efforts to arouse the striking railway men to violence have failed. The three great strikes of the last year—steel, coal and transportation, have each been marked by the absence of any attempts to gain their ends by the destruction of life or property. Labor in general has a sorer view in this regard than it used to have, and realizes that unjust and destructive acts on its part tend to bring the public mind and diver attention from whatever justice there may be in the strikers' demands.

Undoubtedly there is another element to which credit must be given for this more orderly conduct of strikes, and that is prohibition. Not that all strikers drink; but in any great company of men there are always, when liquor is available, some who indulge in it. When a man has been drinking he does not see clear through the logical end of any given act. He sees only life net itself, and that in a false light—"through a glass, darkly."

The fact that the strikers drift back to work, one by one, without waiting for the strike to be settled, is also, I think, in a good many cases to prohibition. There are no saloons to gather in. Saloon eyes can see the anxious look on the wife's face. Idle hours, with neither her nor company to spend their passing, soon become insipidly tedious and the man returns to his job, trusting his cause to arbitration.

With this better understanding on the part of labor, it may now be easier for industrial adjustment to go with promptness, fairness and wisdom.

## DOUGHNUTS PAY TUITION

For students to work their own way through college or university is no new thing. It has been done probably as long as there have been such schools. But it does seem that the modern student is showing a good deal of originality and business ability in his self-support.

There were the New England youths who paid their college expenses by profits from a thriving poultry business. Now it is reported that eight students at the Kansas Agricultural college are putting themselves through school by means of the well-known doughnut.

Their's is no modest business venture. They are incorporated as The Perfect Bakery, with a capital of \$15,000. Expert bakers turn out the doughnuts, hot rolls and other bakery products, which are sold at the store and also supplied to many fraternity houses and boarding places.

The bakery is wisely located near the campus where students can drop in for a sack of good things between classes. It has become the custom for "Auggie" men and women to munch doughnuts instead of chocolates during their hours of social intercourse.

## DEVICE MAKES MINES SAFE

Gephone Is New Invention to  
Enable Miners to Detect  
Sounds Underground

WASHINGTON, April 23.—After a series of mine explosions, the new device for detecting devices invented during the war by the French to detect and locate enemy underground operations, has been adopted by the government of the interior, announces that this delicate instrument may be put to a number of remarkable uses.

The most extraordinary result of these tests is that the bureau of mines have been able, not only to characterize the different sounds made by various explosives, but also to determine the exact location of the fuse in a tunnel, the mine foreman who was listening heard workers in another tunnel, 1,500 feet away, and immediately ordered the miners to retire until the blast was fired. The sounds were so clear that the mine foreman could tell exactly what had occurred.

The greatest value of the gephone in mining, so far as is known, will be in connection with rescue work. It may be used to detect the presence of miners who have been buried in coal dust or earth.
