

ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF HOME DEMONSTRATION WORK HELD SATURDAY

All But Two Communities Represented—Mature Plans For Furthering Various Lines of Work

The annual conference of local leaders of the Home Demonstration was held Saturday at the Farm Bureau office with but two communities represented. This meeting was to have been held two weeks ago but on account of the influenza the leaders did not get in. The projects were taken up in the following order: First, cleaning and renovating demonstrations, with plans for May 15th at the home of Mrs. W. P. Worth. Also, the clothing specialist, to be in most homes every all day session. The women planned a banquet lunch which will be held at the work. At this meeting it is planned that cleaning and renovating materials will be distributed so that materials may be prepared for the millinery work and clothing renovating work which is being carried on and will be more extensive in the fall.

Plans for future millinery work will be furnished by a training class of local leaders to be held in clothing specialties. This work, through a committee of five, will be inclusive. At this time, the 13 leaders will come with their materials and make full reports for the year. They go back to their communities, make arrangements for classes they called for in the winter, and help the home demonstration agent when she comes to give the lecture. In this way, the community will have its leader with her to conduct the millinery work and finish up after the agent has been started by the Home Demonstration agent. Three days in the month are to be set aside for each home. It is proposed not only to make her but to know just how the others have made, the trainings, children, etc. Mrs. Mark Dean, then gave her experience, as president leader, on the lunch work at Shannock school last year.
