THE PRICE OF COTTON

Farmers generally seem to make a pretty good case for themselves when they deny that they are profitereing. The cotton phaners, however, with have a pertty heart time persuading the public that they are playing fair if they insist on holding cutton this year for 60 cents a pound. The American Cotton association resolved to do that at its recent-convention in Montgomery, Ma.

Cotton is not selling around 40 cents a pound, and manufacturers and codistancers consider it high. The price may be jibilifiable, at that; but can a raise of 50 per cent more be justified?

Secretary of Agriculture Merchith stated, in a recent talk to the South Carolina Cotton association, that the averance cast of producing cotton in 1918 was 23 cents a pound, and the "bulk line civit" was 28 cents. On the basis of this theoretical 28 cent rate, 85 per cent of the cotton crop would have been prinduced at a profit. 
