"SECTION 17.—SPRINKLING WHEN SHALL CEASE.—Fountains and aprinkling for lawns, yards or gardens shall not be operated during, or after any atarm of fire until signal is given that fire is out. Sprinkling shall not sprinkling systems, gardens and yards, must only be used for the purpose paid for. No nozle for sprinkling shall be larger than one fourth inch in diameter. No sprinkling of home or gardens, shall be allowed after the home of it o'closely m."

We respectfully ask our patrons to observe the terms and provisions of the above rules and ordinance.
