### IS HOOVER A POSSIBILITY?

THE Spokesman Review thinks Hoover is yet a presidential possibility. Says that newspaper: "Has the loss of his home state by a decisive Johnson victory put Mr. Hoover out of the presidential running? His campaign manager in California still insists that 'the issues represented by Hoover will continue to command the attention of the country and eventually beat the republican convention. Hoover will be nominated for the presidency; but the prevalent campaign manager optimism's speaks there and the wish is father to the thought.'"

"Truly 'the wish is father to the thought.' From all reports which have come this far from the rendezvous of the leaders who lead there seems to be a marked unanimity of opinion among them that the U. S. P. candidate will be inevitable at the polls this year. Why would the republican party nominate a man of Mr. Hoover's brief residence in this country, shorter period of political activity, even in the matter of voting, and who went from party aboutness into the republican party by raising the tent and crawling into the wigwag, so to say?"

"Of course, Mr. Hoover has good ideas; of course he is an able man; of course he has secured as a successful promoter. Yet, when all is admitted that Mr. Hoover's most ardent supporter would wish agreed to in regard to his array of abilities, why is he better than scores of other men for chief executive of this country?"

Mr. Hoover's campaign was, to start with, planned with a good deal of psychological knowledge. His idea, or his managers', of refusing to be a candidate is a trick as old as the clammy groupings of the cliff dwellers. It works "immensely" on the "great unwashed," as Dickens termed the "lovely common people." After quite a sufficient time as a non-candidate he announced himself as a republican. What had the republicans done in the meantime to change his idea and plan of waiting until the parties announced their platforms before he would say with which party he would be aligned? Nothing of course. The time was merely ripe, "and rotten ripe," for ringing in on the great composite mind of the world loves a change.

Now, about the utmost that Mr. Hoover's promoters are expecting is this: They practically know that he has no chance at the republican convention; they think, however, that if the republican convention disowns him and a deadlock develops at the democratic convention, the democrats might take him up as the most likely gather-all of liberal votes.

### THE JUDICIAL TEMPERAMENT.

LIKELY the reason why judges are criticized so much is because their work is so much in the open and in matters where people expect action in opposite directions.

Many a good judge is damned unmercifully for following the "supreme law of the land" in cases where the mob mind would rule otherwise. And it cannot then be said that ultimately the mob mind will be found to be right. One year the mob mind will abolish capital punishment; the next year, or within a few years, it will reestablish the eye-for-eye doctrine. A recent example is the State of Washington, which has as conglomerate a mob mind as has any state in the Union. Oregon has abolished capital punishment at and is seriously and unhesitatingly considering returning to it.

"There are many judges who have not the 'judicial temperament.'" An exchange criticizes Judge Frazer of Seattle for denying the application of a Belgian for citizenship because he had expressed sympathy for the I. W. W. Of course, a judge of the right probity and temperament would not have done that, not once in a billion years. A judge should rule according to law. Judge Frazer, likely, sent the irascible strata of his mind organ too far zealously for judicial thought to come to him. He is not suited for all-round fitness for the bench. That is putting the case mildly. He is given to hasty conclusions more becoming to enthusiastic thinking of nisi prius forums.

Then, as our exchange says, the judge may get "out of himself"—for he is a kind hearted man—and regret his action. Yet there are cases in which the judge—all such judges—can not have an opportunity to review his own decisions. In most jurisdictions, a justice of the peace has not the power to amend his own judgment. In higher courts there are many instances where the losing party does not ask for a review, nor trial or vantage of the judgment.

All this is saying that judges should be selected largely for their judicial temperament. It is not so important that the judge know all the law, for not one of them does, but he should be disposed to hear through the lawyer who has himself looked up the precedents, and should check any innate proclivity to render snap-shot decisions.

Judge Frazer is merely typical of a class, and it is feared that the class will continue inconveniently large until we have a way of selecting judges calculated to place on the bench more men who are really the fittest for the work. The present system of popular selection can never be anything but an ill-advised scheme of rough and ready approximation.

### AFFAIRS IN NEW ZEALAND

New Zealand, at the present time, is in much the same position as a character in a well-known play, who, having earned a reputation for progress, has been outstripped in the early days of his career, real or imaginary, by a younger man, only to be rudely awakened, at the time the play opens, to the fact that he has been thoroughly outstripped. True, the comparison between Roebuck Ramsden and New Zealand ceases very shortly after the opening scene, but it is a fact that, during the great Liberal period, extending for over twenty years, from 1890 onward, New Zealand gained a world-wide reputation for advanced social and industrial legislation, and that recently that reputation has not been maintained.

In the latter part of the long Liberal regime, Mr. Massey, the present Premier, as leader of the old Conservative Party, was chiefly famous as a "brake on the Liberal coach." So one could regard him as being, in the words of the word, a reactionary, the probable impression being, when he was returned to power in 1912, that he would be a "brake on the Liberal coach." The recent strike of railroad switchmen who left demoralized transportation in and out of many market centers that month may have important effects upon food production during the coming year.

This strike came at a time when the meat and live stock industry was in process of readjusting. Foreign exchange unfavorable to purchasers abroad had barred American meat products from the European market. The demand their sale relations, many producers seemed to feel that the nation's call for more production might mean loss to them.

Despite this pessimism the industry secured on the point of finding itself and going ahead on a fresh basis. Then the switchmen quit work and a stagnation of traffic movement followed.

Growers and feeders of live stock were among the heaviest losers. During the strike shipments of cattle and hogs were tied in transit and the loss from shrinkage was serious. On the other hand live stock ready for the market had to be kept on farms, requiring high priced feed and adding to the costs daily.

There is reason to believe that this line, pulled on the uncertainty of reconstruction, will give added momentum to the trend toward expanded production.

All during the strike the packs uncovered at all points movements of fresh meat toward the big consuming centers, but with this accomplished aimless in dressed meats, particularly in the East, have been interrupted. All transportation lines only interfering with packing houses have been seriously handicapped by operations.

Of course the brunt of these things will fall upon the workers first of all. Regardless of the merits of the strike, whatever the switchmen may have gained may be lost several times over a year hence in increased food costs and in scarcity of food supplies. We know of no incident later calculated to bring home to large numbers of men the far-reaching consequences of their strike.

During the month of April, conditions in the fresh meat trade have

been abnormal in account of the strike. Receipts of live stock have been irregular and shipments of live stock have been irregular and shipments of dressed meats, particularly in the East, have been interrupted. All transportation lines only interfering with packing houses have been seriously handicapped by operations.

Early in April reduced receipts resulted in material advances in price on most grades of live cattle. Later in the month receipts were nearly up to normal and the advance was practically wiped out. Values at the end of the month were about the same as prior to the strike.

Fresh meat prices advanced on account of the shortage of supplies. To a certain extent this increase was offset by the marketing of considerable quantities of frozen beef and beef

cuts, a supply of which was available at reasonable prices.

Although the advance in the price of fresh beef was considerable, especially in large cities of the East, the situation did not become critical.

The hot week of April has seen increased supplies of fresh beef on the market following the increase in marketing of live cattle. These factors coupled with resumption of normal freight movements have resulted in lowering dressed beef prices which are fast approximating levels prevailing before the strike.

LONDON, May 14.—"I think I have a better chance to win the cup than any other boat," said Sir Thomas Lipton, when questioned regarding his challenger, the Shamrock IV, which will compete for the America's cup in July.

"The Shamrock IV is different from any boat that has ever been built," continued Sir Thomas. "She has been built for the purpose of fitting the cup, and I believe she will succeed."

Just how the Shamrock IV differs from any other yacht ever built can only be properly explained—according to Lipton's practical, practical, practical and some of the things must, of course, be kept secret. It must appear therefore, to say that the Shamrock IV is a new kind of boat and that she has a better chance of capturing the cup than any of my previous craft.

I am confident that they will be very anxious to see the Shamrock IV, and I expect to bring the cup back to the side of the America's cup."

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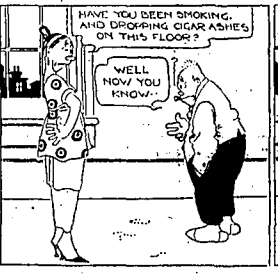

come the perpetual dictator of Mexico. But now, as you see, his army has failed him. He evidently must have a great sum of money with him; otherwise the federal generals now with him would have deserted him ere this. "I will make myself clear," he concluded, "I am a broad grin. Then he continued:

"Your past opposition to me has put me in a mood of my own. But, as you know, I have been accused of violation of the confidence through pronounced and circulated by Carranza and his cohorts. To prove to you that my word is taken at its value, I will see that in ten days I dispatched six of my men to various railway regions of this state and I selected the railroad officials that they had nothing new to fear from me and that armed guards could be withdrawn from all trains, in both the states of Chihuahua and Durango.

"Now travelers are safe to come and go at will and have no fear that they will meet them in territory occupied by myself or any of my men. The railroad officials have taken me at my word, and no doubt you observed that the train which brought you to this city without the usual armed guard."

Asked for expression as to the present revolution and what he thought Villa brought his shoulders. Then he said:

"There will be no more revolutions in Mexico after this one has been brought to a successful conclusion. The revolution is over and over and over. It is the revolution in its years, and well, practice makes perfect."

"I admire the manner in which General Calles launched his war against Carranza. He was like a man in a poker game—he had nothing to stay on, but called Carranza's bluff to send him into the state of Sonora, and he made his bluff stick."

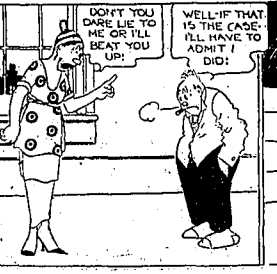
