

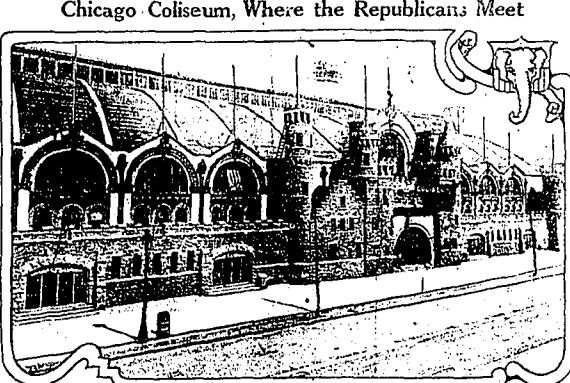

### DRYS WILL CALL CANDIDATES TO STATE ATTITUDE

Big Prohibition Mass Meeting Set for June 6 at Beacon of O. P. Convention

CHICAGO, June 4.—A gigantic mass meeting of prohibition forces from all parts of the United States has been called for Chicago June 6 which all presidential candidates will be invited to attend and state their position with reference to the eighteenth amendment.

### HOUSE COMMITTEE FAVORS REJECTION OF MANDATE

WASHINGTON, June 4.—The house foreign relations committee ordered a favorable report on a resolution passed by the senate denying the presidential authority to accept a mandate. Chairman Horton stated that he would urge early action by the house.

Democratic members of the committee attempted to obtain a vote for a sub-resolution denying the authority only until after ratification of the peace treaty.

The sub was voted down.

### PACKER BILL HELD OVER

WASHINGTON, June 4.—The federal trade commission was given approval of the packer industry and interstate commerce commission control of the combined stock yards and facilities under the provisions of the bill to regulate packers which was reported today to the full house by the committee on commerce.

The full committee took no action on the bill, but declined to make it the first in the order of business at the next session.

### THOSE BEHIND OF BRITISH FLAG

WASHINGTON, June 4.—The state department asked the District of Columbia commissioners today for a full report upon the holding of a British flag in front of the treasury yesterday by pro-British sympathizers. It is understood that the state department would demand action against the women who burned the flag.

No statement was forthcoming from the state department as to whether the British Embassy had protested against the incident.

### E. S. DESTROYER PATRIOTS MEN

WASHINGTON, June 4.—The American destroyer, Dale, which has been cruising along the western coast of Mexico, in anticipation of disorders in the interior has returned to her station at Vera Cruz, according to a report received today by the navy department. Capt. B. A. Long, commanding the destroyer division in Mexican waters, reports that the Dale's trip along the coast was entirely quiet.

### CONGRESS WILL QUIT SATURDAY

Adjournment sine die is Concorded in by Senate and Important Bills Wait

WASHINGTON, June 4.—By a vote of 41 to 24 the senate this afternoon concurred in the house resolution providing for adjournment of congress sine die at 4 p. m. on Saturday, June 5.

The action was taken after considerable opposition from Senator Kenyon of Iowa and Sen. Jones of Washington, co-sponsors Sen. Reed, democrat of Missouri, who urged that congress should not adjourn pending legislation is complete. Sen. Reed declared it was necessary to repeal wartime laws, now in effect.

### WASHINGTON, June 4.— President Wilson will not object to an adjournment of congress on Saturday and he will not call congress into extra session after adjournment unless there is some "grave public necessity".

An amendment to the adjournment resolution was offered by Sen. Kenyon of Iowa, providing for a recess to July 12. That amendment was defeated by a vote of 29 to 47.

### INCREASE POSTAL SALARIES

WASHINGTON, June 4.—The house this afternoon passed a bill providing increased salaries in wages for postal employees, as recommended by the joint postal commission. The bill carries an appropriation of \$44,376,047 for fiscal year 1921.

### RAILWAY ASKS LOAN

WASHINGTON, June 4.—The Kansas City, Mexico and Orient railway applied today for a loan of \$8,000,000 from the interstate commerce commission providing fund created by the Cummins Fuel Act.

### REAL ESTATE MEN'S CONVENTION AT KANSAS CITY

KANSAS CITY, Mo., June 3.—Plenty of pep will mark the thirtieth annual convention of the National Association of Real Estate Boards which opens here today. In other words, the real estate men will put the same "pep" into their convention program as they did into their sales.

An unusually tall man and woman, seen by a neighbor in the vicinity of the Coughlin home just before the kidnapping, are being sought and search is also being made for the writer of a letter who confesses to the stealing of the child.

However, the police are inclined to believe the writer of the letter is a crank.

In addition to the \$1,500 reward offered by the officers of Montgomery county for the capture of the abductors, the Coughlin family have offered \$500 for the safe return of their child.

"They're at a back window telephone" blared.

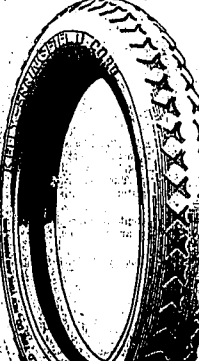
"The 'wretch' escaped through the rear porch" to the back house. Sure enough a "burliar" object was at a window.
