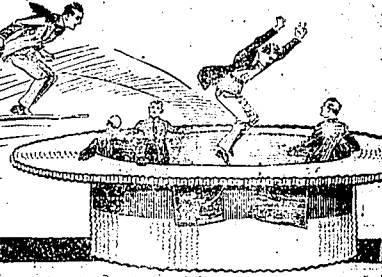

**WHY BONDS DECLINED.**

PEOPLE borrowed to buy but they did not save to pay. This is the answer Robert S. Weeks, member of the firm of Harris, Forbes and Company of Boston, and bond expert, gives to those who ask him why Liberty Bonds are now selling below par. Mr. Weeks explains that when it became necessary to raise the immense amount needed during war times, most banks agreed to lend money to the government. Consideration also should be given to the fact that higher rates of interest on Government bonds would have resulted in greater depreciation in market value of other interest bearing securities and in the cost of money for all.

## NAVY TO OPEN BOYS' SCHOOLS

Two Institutions for Summer Months Planned To Train Young Men of Nation

The Navy will establish two summer schools for boys between the ages of sixteen and twenty years. One school will be at Great Lakes, Ill., and the other at Hampton Roads, Virginia. The courses will be of six weeks' length and the institutions will be largely practical. It will include physical development, physical education of instructor and the cultivation of Naval traditions, literature and religious instruction. Each boy must enroll in the Naval Reserve Force for not less than three years. Applicants must pass necessary examinations, physical and scholastic, that are prescribed for their enrollment in the Naval Reserve Force.
