

NO HOPE SEEN OF REACHING DECISIVE VOTE TODAY; McADOO LEADS ON BALLOTS WITH COX GAINING; PALMER RUNS THIRD

AUDITORIUM, San Francisco, July 3, (UP)—Capturing the biggest portion of the New Jersey and New York votes on the seventh ballot, Governor Cox of Ohio moved up into second place, next to W. G. McAdoo.

Cox gained 68 in New Jersey, and 25 in New York. The official totals of the voters on this ballot were McAdoo 384; Cox 208; Palmer 207.

The Ohioan's sensational spurt was marked by a big demonstration. The official tally clerks had great difficulty straightening out their figures on the seventh ballot and there was considerable delay while they worked over them. The band tried to fill in the gap. The Ohio crowd was jubilant at the result of the ballot.

It is a safe bet that there are many very good republicans and many very good democrats who watched the G. O. P. convention with weariness, and who are watching the democratic convention because it is democratic and always interesting from a point of view, who will keep eyes glued on Chicago this month to see what the "third party" is going to do. The "committee of 48" already has been busy with its publicity and within the next few days before the convention meets, some new political promises may loom up from the action of the windy city.
