SURPLUS OF HARVEST LABOR

NEWS dispatch from Ponca City, Okla., indicates the way in which the wage schedule, if lifted unconditionally, may prove a boon to the very people who are supposed to be benefited. Oklahoma is reported to be surfeited with labor. "There are three men for every job in the harvest field."

The explanation follows that the farmers are employing the fewest men possible. They are doing the work with members of their own families. Wives and daughters are running tractors, driving teams and handling self-binders. This enables many farmers to get along with only one outside helper.

This simply means that harvest wages have been lifted to a point where they are enticing to the women members of the farmers' families, and large numbers of workers, after spending money to get into the harvest region, are standing around, on expense and without employment. Before long these men will have to turn elsewhere in search of employment. They will then begin to compete with others in the labor market. It may later turn out that this condition in the harvest regions was the entering wedge that broke the labor market in other industries.

nic privilege which has grown more powerful than slavery ever became. "If we can unite there is ground to hope that in the future we will have formed a political party with a platform through which the majority of our fellow citizens can realize a hope too long deferred. Failure will strike a severe blow at a generation already disappointed once for all by the collapse of the progressive party; and again by the incomprehensible conduct between the words and the deeds of the present administration.

Reps Old Parties
The platform of the two old parties might have been written by a convention of corporation lawyers and Wall Street bankers, McCurdy said, and added:

"Over the trail of these national failures it is to be drawn the picture of international relations. This is an ancient trick of reaction. If it were in 1920 in the American people will discover too late that they have assumed the position of a man grasping a morsel of bread from a pickpocket may more easily relieve him of his possessions. How dare we permit foreign relations to dominate this campaign? Exploited ourselves, shall we give the power to exploit other peoples to our own exploiters?"
The republican bid is bold. It reads out of its counsels every man and woman who ever stood for any form of human rights adopts a platform that erases, equivoques or straddles every living issue, paves the way for a war by which in exchange for lives and treasure of the people, Mexico shall be delivered to the interests; endorses the infamous Each-Commissaire bill over the protests of farmers, workers and informed citizens and consistently crowns its work by nominating a candidate for the presidency a proven, steady wheel-horse politician guaranteed to stand without flinching.

"The democratic bid is more than bold; it is brazen. With mild reservations it not only claims a partisan credit which belongs to the whole nation, for floundering and winning the war, but it also claims it administered the conduct of that war without the stain of scandal. And the ghosts of Iloilo Island, Alarcon and Subulungan and countless other victims of native-gent appropriations are still striking through the land."
Alleges Fall is Broken
"Nor is that all. Failure to protect a people against peddling in time

of war might be forgiven but to break the faith of a whole nation cannot be forgiven. That is the bitter experience of these past years. We all remember with gratitude the words that thrilled our hearts and kindled a fervent hope that we were really in the dawn of a new day. We felt the inspiration of a leader who was to guide us into a more complete realization of the things we had always held nearest our hearts.
"It is by these words the democratic party must be judged. By these words it is weighed in the balance and found unworthy of human confidence. For into the expectant hope went the disquieting arm of plutocrats and palace intrigues every vestige of civil liberty we ever held dear and turning the light of freedom into darkness."
McCurdy attacked Palmer, saying the democratic party through its endorsement of that officer's work would lead "us back to the days of Phillip II of Spain and the unspeakable atrocities of Austria and counter its inquisitions, secret police, spies, espionage, arrests without warrants, service prisons, legal denunciations and star chamber proceedings to suppress the methods provided in the bill of rights which has been the bulwark of Anglo-Saxon freedom for nine centuries."
Abolish Economic Privilege
The proposed platform "abolish economic privilege," he said, declares the principal cause of the distress of this people, is economic in its nature and can be removed only by economic action.
"No reference is made to any political reform," McCurdy said. "With privilege abolished they will not be needed. Other needed improvements into organizations of government will afford no relief until after privilege is abolished."
McCurdy said the committee of 48 endorses the right of labor to bargain collectively and denounces the use of injunctions in labor cases.
"The greatest need of labor," he said, "is the greatest need of the whole country: not more laws, but more liberty. The farmers have always discovered and have acted upon this fact. Not until the farmers of
