WHAT'S THE USE?

As a last resort, a tentative offer might be made by the leaders of the labor party to accept the platform of delegates from the joint convention and form their own "third party."

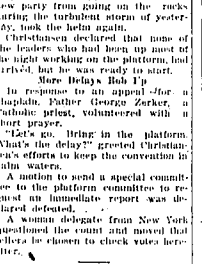
Success of the labor union would be tantamount to the platform of the original 48 convention, and a record favoring surrender to the labor party would be the result.

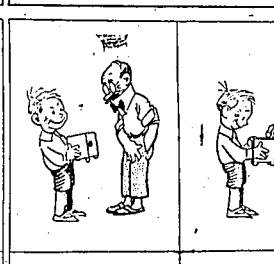

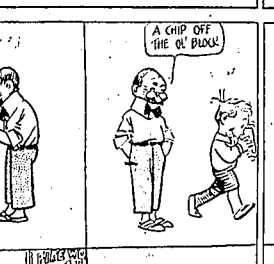
