COAL DEMAND IS ACCEPTED BY DELEGATES

Germany Agrees to Delivery of 2,000,000 Tons Monthly, and Necessity of Allied Occupation Is Obscured; Germans to Submit Protest on Terms.

Allies Prepared to Move Into Territory

Final Ultimatum Was Ready to Be Handed to Germans in Case Demands Rejected

SPA, July 15.—Foreign Minister Balfour in an interview today declared the Germans had done all possible toward meeting the allied demands, and that the allies will agree with us, but if they make an invasion of Germany, I suppose we will have to.

The conditions under which the German delegation agreed to accept the allied ultimatum is that the allies must send a mixed commission to Essen to study conditions and supervise feeding of the population.

Germany must be given necessary credit to purchase food. Reparations must be allowed the entire output of the mines of upper Silesia, or be guaranteed 1,000,000 tons monthly to supply her own industries.

SPA, Belgium, July 15. (UP)—Germany has accepted by ultimatum demand for delivery of 2,000,000 tons of coal monthly, thereby obtaining necessary fuel for the occupation of the Ruhr, which had been completed.

Dr. Bismarck of the German delegation, notified Premier Lloyd George of the German delegation's decision.

The Germans will submit a protest against the coal terms and will offer indemnities for the requisition of the coal. Acceptance of the ultimatum means after our terms. The ultimatum was prepared by allied forces Friday morning if the demands were refused.

Allies Ready for Occupation. The allied decision to enforce the coal terms was announced by Premier Miller.

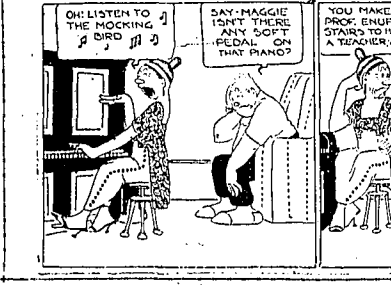

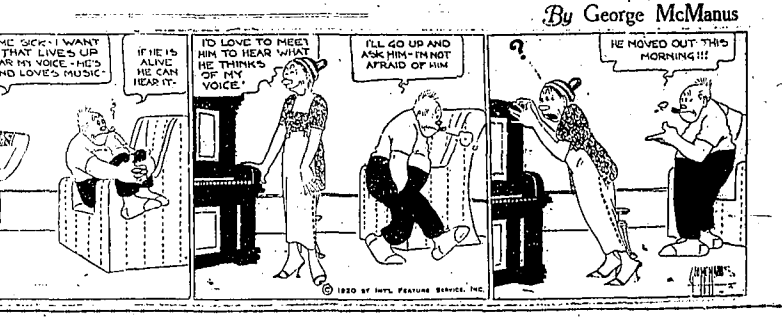
