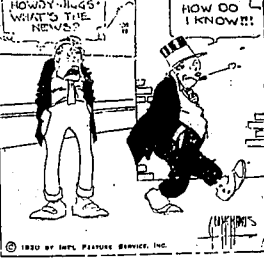
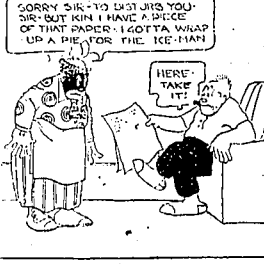
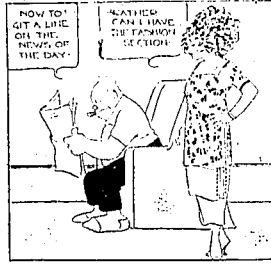

### Junior Track Meet is Held

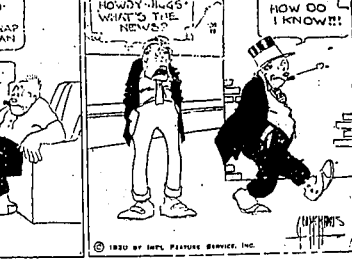
Olympic Tryouts Are Being Staged Today at the Stadium at Harvard University
