YOUNGEST SON OF EX-KAISER DIES SUICIDE

Prince Joachim Takes Life by Shooting Himself in Breast as He Lies Abed

Death a Love Tragedy Wife's Desertion and Drunken Debauch Play Part in Tragic End

BERLIN, July 19. (UP)—Prince Joachim, eldest and youngest of the ex-emperor's six sons, committed suicide by shooting himself in the breast as he lay in bed at the Villa Lilliput in Kew St. park Saturday as a result of brooding over his wife's desertion and the death of a daughter, declared yesterday night, according to belief here today.

Prince Joachim, the only one of the ex-emperor's sons now in Berlin, issued a formal statement declaring Joachim's suicide was the result of "psychic disturbance caused by the pressure of events and personal difficulties."

Believed Love Tragedy
Friends of the dead prince declared the suicide to be a love tragedy. They tried to mention that he had returned to his villa from Berlin Friday night, bringing into a second-class waiting room the Potsdam railway station where he called fondly for her. He introduced himself to the watch as Prince Joachim of Prussia and said he had no railway ticket.

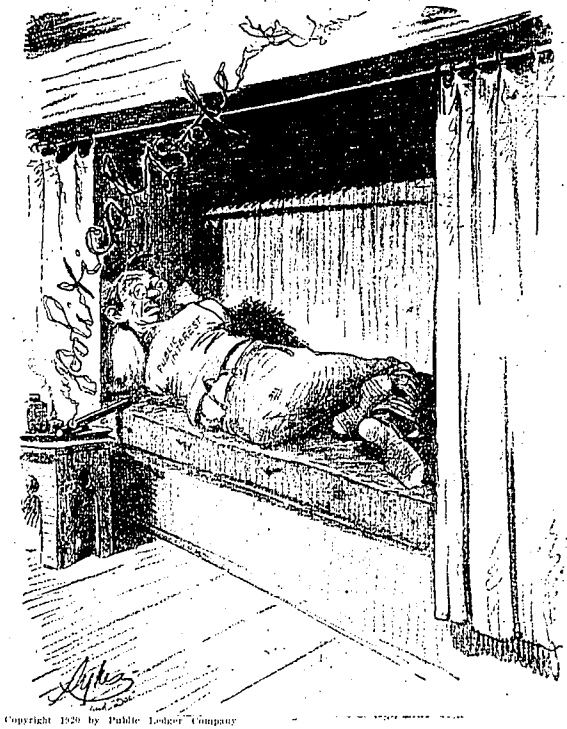

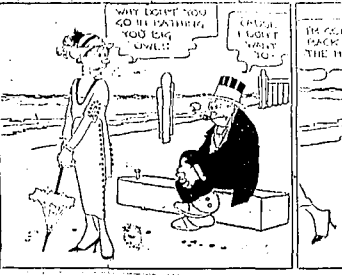

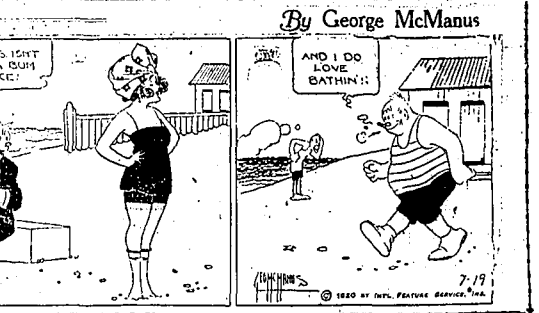
