Preliminary skirmishing for decisive engagement before Warsaw expected to start on Tuesday according to latest dispatches from front.

Red Cavalry Moving Along the Railroad

Polish Outposts Keep in Contact With Enemy But Make No Attempt to Stand

WARSAW, Aug. 12.—(U.P.)—As armed women march through the streets of Warsaw today, announcing they would take the city to death. Some had only Revolvers, others carried rifles and sabres. Many old men and youths have gone to the defenses being established near the city which they are not daring to enter to grips with the invaders.

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LONDON, Aug. 12.—Sharp skirmishing preliminary to another major engagement will be in progress on the Warsaw front early Tuesday, according to the latest dispatches from Moscow and Warsaw.

On the body were found business cards and correspondence which for a time had led the authorities to believe the dead man was Arner.
