LONDON, Aug. 28.—(Civil strife in Ireland has spread to Queenstown, where serious rioting occurred last night. British soldiers, reported for an attack on a motor bus near (Castle) Mary's church, which a (Catholic) Highlander was killing and a lieutenant wounded, left their barracks and began to burn the houses and business places of Irish republicans.
