

AMERICAN-JAPANESE SITUATION.

MEANMENDANJAPANDSE SITUATION.

ME American Inpanies situation grows in difficulty and delicacy daily. Fundamentally two things stand against good relations between these two nations. First is the feel ing on Japan's part that the United States is deliberately wheeling whatever hope Japan may have of gaining prosperity for her overpopulation by way of China. Secondly, is the difficulty experienced in this country in making the Japanese understand that the Cali-fornia exclusion acts are the work of one state, which the whole forms exclusion acts are the work of one state, which the whole country does not feel justified in stopping. For a hong time con-versations have been going joi between the Japanese ambassador and the state department, but so for the tominence of the new legislation in Culifornia has rendered, these conversations almost fruitless. Discrimination against American goods arriving at Kohe in Januarese bottoms has been charged and numerous other irritafrom, usually small things in themselves, find their way into the argument. The Japanese insist that their present negotiations in the United States have nothing more in view than the preservation of rights already granted to the Japanese in America. Beyond the American question there is for Japan the fact that America's attitrule, particularly if it is a severe one, may be adopted by several British dominions and that consequently Japan's position toward ber ally, Britain, may be jeopardized.

CHINA AND RUSSIA.

The action of Chino in refusing further to grout diplomatic courtesy to the representatives of the former exarist Russian government has stirred the United States and the Alfred nations of Europe to inquiry and this may lead to protest. Technically the Chinese claim that these diplomatic representatives no longer are empowered to represent, since the Russian government does not recognize them, or rather since they have no government at all, is probably irrepresentable.
