THE TIPPING EVIL.

PROBABLY there are many persons who are accustomed to giving tips freely who would be indignant if anyone should offer a tip to them. Yet in all fairness it is difficult to see why there should be objection to receiving, if there is no ground for objection to giving.

Butter, down 5 cents; eggs, 1 cent; potatoes, 5 cents; corn, 1 cent; wheat, 1 cent; a bushel, 20 to 40 per cent; flour, 10 to 15 per cent; sugar, 1 cent; molasses, 20 to 40 per cent; lard, 10 to 15 per cent; tallow, 10 to 15 per cent; wool, 10 to 15 per cent; hides, 10 to 15 per cent; skins, 10 to 15 per cent; furs, 10 to 15 per cent; and many other commodities.

AT CLEVELAND

CLEVELAND, Oct. 10 (AP)—While some commodities have advanced in price here, business men said today that a genuine "softening" drop cannot be expected. The market is "dogging" from the present level of prices.

All kinds of foods in restaurants have dropped from 10 to 15 per cent. Soft coal dropped 10 per cent and flour 10 to 15 per cent. Wholesale coal and flour 10 to 15 per cent on the retail price.

AT PORTLAND, ORE.

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 10 (AP)—The price of clothing in Portland is 20 per cent lower than before the war. Present price reduction was started sweeping the country, declared the selling commission today.

However, we can see no further price reductions during the winter and spring, for the lowering of prices here was entirely due to a local situation—competition and the fear that prices might "drop."

Food dealers believe the lowering of the price of certain food-stuffs is only the start of a general reduction in the cost of living. Sugar has shown the greatest price drop in Portland, 32 1/2 percent. Flour has dropped 10 to 15 per cent and eight groceries have been reduced in the price of vegetables, butter, poultry, poultry and pork.

AT DENVER

DENVER, Oct. 10 (AP)—Prices of clothing took a drop here today when one of the largest retailers in Denver announced reductions of from 20 to 50 per cent. Other dealers have followed in the movement, although not to such an extent.

Denver restaurants have announced price cuts on their bills of fare. Meat orders have been reduced 15 cents, pig from 15 to 10 cents and bread and butter orders cost 5 cents less.

Sugar is selling to jobbers for \$11 a hundred. Retailers are selling it for 13 cents a pound.

AT SAN FRANCISCO

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 10 (AP)—Although a number of commodities have been affected by the downward trend of prices reported in the east this morning, the market here is generally here, according to dealers in various lines.

Frank H. Connelly, secretary of the Retail Grocers' association, looked for more general drops in food prices. "This fall, however, sugar, coffee and cereals with a few less important products have been particularly affected," sugar has dropped 10 per cent in the last two months. Flour was expected to join the downward trend soon.

Clothing men reported no important recent price reductions. Eggs retailed here today at 15 cents under the influence of a market that was upward trend. Butter dropped two cents last week.

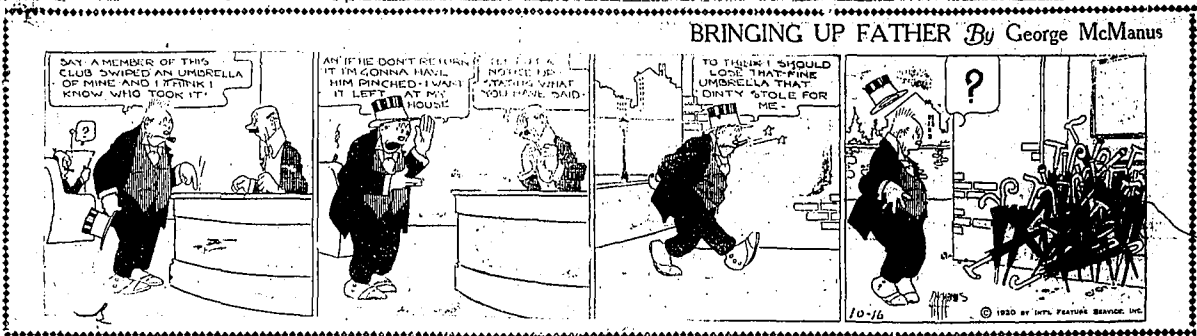

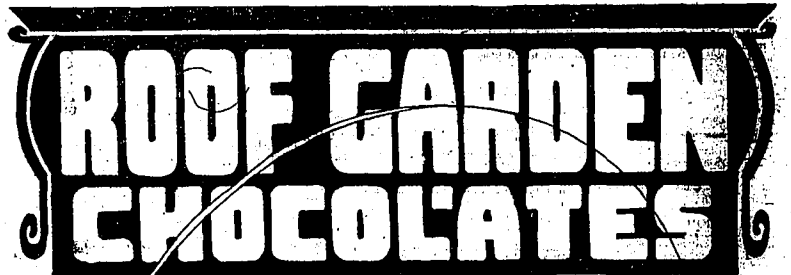
