CHICAGO, March 9.—The history of how the railroad interests of the country arrived at the decision to abrogate the 1892 international agreement, was revealed today by the United States labor secretary in testimony before a committee of the Association of Illinois Manufacturers.

Frank J. Walsh, attorney representing railroad interests, testified that the railroad owners had agreed to the abrogation and only one—W. W. Atterbury, general manager of the Pennsylvania and connected with the Pennsylvania, New York and Philadelphia, failed to state his position in regard to the international agreement in certain members of the committee.

Walsh did not attempt to influence members of the committee. Officially, Walsh said, the railroad owners had agreed to the abrogation of the 1892 international agreement, which was adopted by the committee.

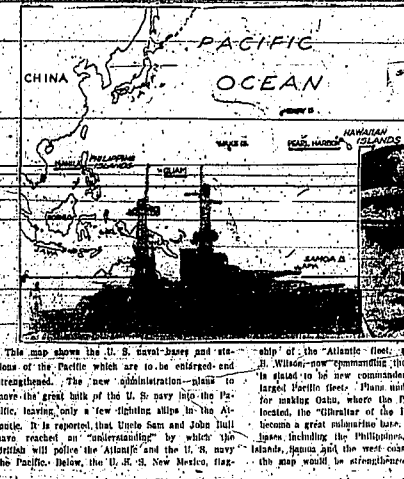

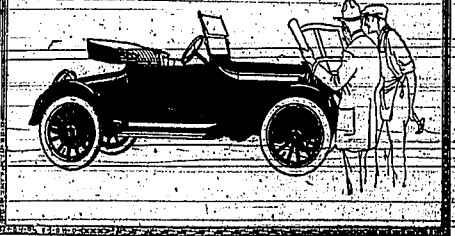

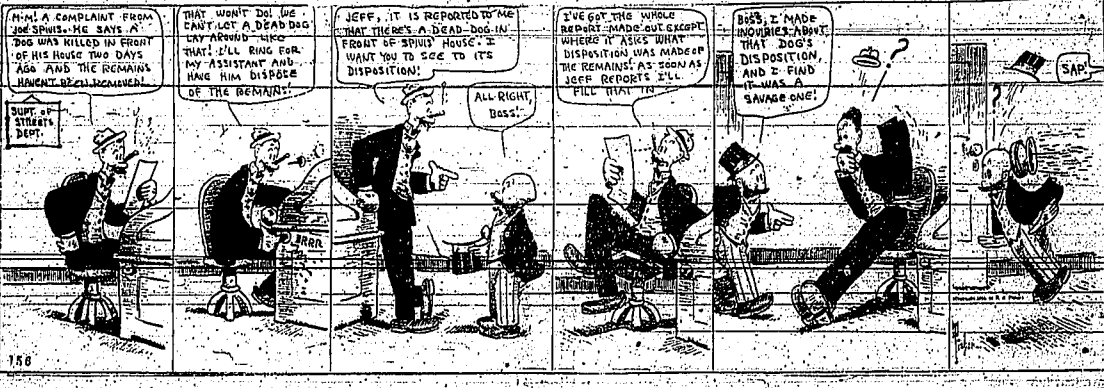
