Our terms of sale are from \$100 to \$200, with no down payment, with the balance payable in 10 or 12 equal payments, with interest at 6 per cent, and with a cash payment of from \$2,000 to \$4,000 on a quarter section or improved land.

We will balance payable on crop payment plan, or a long term of years. On account of the scarcity of money at the present time we have arranged to sell a number of farms at ridiculously low prices, because we are convinced that there will be the biggest profit in getting into this district now—that we have never had yet, for farmers are not going to farm high priced land at a loss when they may farm LOW PRICED LAND AT A PROFIT.

It is the opinion of all of those farmers who have taken up land here that this land is worth as much as any land producing similar crops in the irrigated portions of the Western States. We command higher prices for produce and have unlimited markets, and these are not going to rise, continue until this land is as high in value as the prairie from 1 to 100 miles. So it is well advised, all who are interested, not to wait until this land is sold for \$200 or \$300 an acre, but to get in now when you can get in for \$100 an acre, and take the rise in land value yourself.

TAXATION

The entire taxes on the best improved portion of land in the Coaldale District in 1920 were \$244. This is made up as follows: School tax, \$80; road tax, \$14; water, maintenance, \$150.
