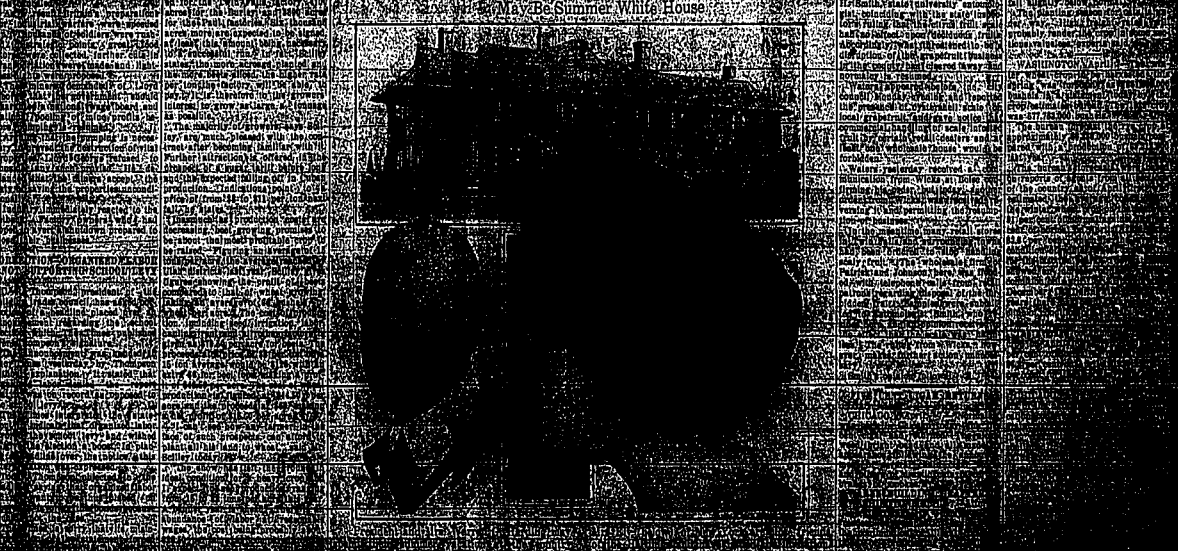

School Levy Election

If the school levy election fails on Friday afternoon to carry by a two-thirds majority and the schools close and remain closed, a cloud that moment settles over the community that will require years to lift.

3,200 children will be out of school, 110 teachers and 35 wagon drivers out of employment and every citizen in the School District made to suffer by the ruination of our school system.

The good name of the Twin Falls community will be blackened for years to come and all our business competitors who in the past have been so willing to discredit this community will enjoy the opportunity to give us further adverse notoriety.

The value of every piece of property in this district will decrease many more times than the \$20.00 levy rate per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. This is the rate of the levy which will be collected as part of the regular taxes, one-half in January, 1922, the other half in June, 1922, if the levy is voted.

Severe losses and harm would result to the 3,200 boys and girls from closing the schools; by causing the loss of time already spent on partly completed work with consequent loss of credits for uncompleted studies, and causing the general lowering of morale and standards which naturally would come from allowing the children to roam the streets or follow activities less profitable to their growth and development.

Schools Will Remain Closed

The school board has decided by resolution that if the levy election fails to carry, the boys and girls of the District will not go back to the school houses Monday morning.

Do we wish 110 teachers to go out of our community to all parts of the country and advertise us by relating their experiences in Twin Falls?

OUR DEBTS MUST BE PAID

The additional levy must be made some time before the school warrants that have and should be drawn can be paid.

We will never get out of paying the debts we owe; they must be met sometime and the salaries of the teachers which according to their contracts should have been paid monthly, will be collectable by the teachers whether the schools remain closed or are kept open by the voting of the levy at this time.

The auditor of the school accounts has shown by his figures that it will cost only \$17,000 more to continue the schools to the end of the year than to close at this time, which would amount to 1.8 mills levy or \$1.80 tax per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. The other debts will all have to be paid sooner or later whether the schools remain open or closed at this time.

The lack of passage of this levy now will be a calamity to the school children, to the teachers, to the property owner in the city and the country alike and to the business world and every citizen in the community.
