WILL LAND VALUES DROP?

You who own land or are thinking of buying, lately have wondered: "Are land values going to depreciate again with the general slump?"

The value of farm land during the past year decreased seven per cent, says the department of agriculture. Here is the estimate of the average value of an acre of plow-land in the United States:

Table with 2 columns: Year and Value. March 1, 1924: \$22.01; March 1, 1923: \$23.00; March 1, 1922: \$24.00; March 1, 1921: \$25.00; March 1, 1920: \$26.00; March 1, 1919: \$27.00; March 1, 1918: \$28.00; March 1, 1917: \$29.00; March 1, 1916: \$30.00.

The drop in farm land values has been greatest in southern states. 40 per cent in Georgia and 24 per cent in Kentucky.

The lowest rate of decline was in western states. California, Oregon and Colorado even showed an increase.

Farm land values, however, are higher now than in any year up to 1920. The slump is due to the crash in prices of farm products.

Whether the slump will continue during the next few years, depends on the selling prices of farm products.

Probably the prediction is only temporary. Single taxers, at least, fill claim so. Their theory is that the trend of land values, as population becomes more dense, is always upward and that land will steadily absorb all increases in wealth produced by farm labor and agriculture.

As for city land, it is subject to the same economic laws as farm land.

Land may decline in value, as measured by dollars, in line with general lowering of cost of living, but the owner doesn't really lose, for his dollar will buy more.

BEAN ASS'N GETS NEEDED ACREAGE SPEAKERS ARE ON THE STUMP

Reports Show Over Thousand Acres Up to Last Night. Got Warehouse.

The two acres in bean contracts required on a minimum by the United Twin Falls Growers Association was exceeded by 25 acres last night when reports from 12 harvesters and 2 C. Peels, who were engaged to dig up acreage were turned in. This resulted in a large loaded warehouse being engaged, arrangements being made for handling the grain on the condition which permits the issuance of warehouse receipts on which loans can be secured. A loan of 25,000 pounds at two cents a pound were turned today.

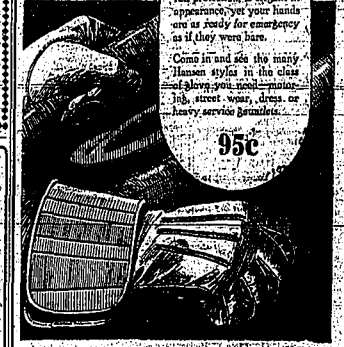

METER QUESTION ANALYZED

In many small spaces in the Times of yesterday's issue we find this statement: "Meter question settled by Citizens Ticket—read ad on page 4." On page four we find the Citizens ticket has finally adopted a platform.

We believe very few people know the status of the waterworks system. In order to explain the matter we give below a history of the plant.

The corporate limits of the city comprise 1480 acres of land, and with each lot there is a paid up water right belonging to the owners of the land of a miner's inch to the acre.

The owners of lots own the water rights to 1440 acres of land within the city, while the city owns water for forty acres. The city owns the waterworks system which is invoiced at \$514,584.88, without any deduction for depreciation.

The revenue of the system is about \$5,000 per month. There are now \$29,000 outstanding deficiency warrants against the waterworks fund.

The city distributes water owned by the consumer and legally can only charge actual cost of operation and maintenance of the system.

some water is carried through ditches for surface irrigating. We have never at any time used the full amount of water to which we are entitled.

The Citizens Ticket claims that the water system of Twin Falls can pay for meters and their installation and refund to users who have paid for those already installed without raising the cost of water to the average consumer.

If the cost of installing meters will reach \$50,000 the system must raise this money in some manner. The estimated revenue for one year is \$60,000 under present rates.

If the system must stand the meter cost there is no way to meet it without an excessive raise in water rates.

Again, why install meters to attempt to relieve a situation caused by an engineering blunder in the construction of the filter plant?

If meters are installed and used, what would be done if the town continues to grow? If the filter

plant is now too small to take care of the requirements of the consumers, it would become more so as the town increased in size.

Again, use of meters requires additional expense in the way of reading and inspecting meters, and in their repair; and extra bookkeeping.

We believe the meters could be salvaged, and some value received out of them.

Mr. Voter, the Citizens Ticket promises you meters just as the present administration attempted to force you to accept them, in order to measure your own water to you as you use it.
