WASHINGTON, April 22.—The United States will have a decisive voice in determining to what extent Germany shall pay for the war.

This was the conclusion in Washington following publication of the German note appealing for President Harding to vacillate in the settlement question and Secretary Hughes to reject the appeal. The note was a warning—implying—regarding the uncertainties between the allies and Germany for a settlement of the problem.

The note from Germany is thought, will be taken to imply the views and principles of the United States in the settlement.

POLYGAMY OUTSIDE THE LAW

Lawyers say that it may be impossible to convict Herbert Thorne if he is charged with bigamy in New Jersey.

Andrews married his first wife in Maine in 1912 and his second in Connecticut in 1921.

A charge of bigamy can be pressed only by the state in which bigamy was committed, and Connecticut has a statute that holds that a bigamy has not been legally committed unless bigamous marriage has been consummated within Connecticut.

As far as Connecticut is concerned, Andrews has only one wife—the one he married in that state. This Connecticut has issued a warrant charging Andrews with bigamy and perjury, but lawyers here think that the bigamy charge will hold.

The following additional minute record to the above was made by Mr. Minnick more than a month after the record had been made and approved by the mayor:
"Bill of \$200.00 for damages to crop and poultry submitted by C. H. Hempleman, caused by break in reservoir bank, cause of break explained by Waterworks Superintendent to be from gopher hole. Water soon were embankment through, causing contents of reservoir to overflow garden and grounds, also the well pit of Clear View Well company, burning out motor, etc.
Regularly moved and seconded and carried bill be included and paid with other water works bills."
Neither the approved minute record nor the explanation is true except that the explanation indicates that \$200.00 of the \$2395.17 was a damage claim. The fact is, that the water was forced thru the bank of the reservoir in an endeavor to raise it high enough to get it thru the new purification plant which was located too high.
In support of the statement that the above records are untrue, an investigation of the waterworks department ledger, as kept by City Treasurer F. E. Wheeler, discloses that warrant No. 99 for \$200.00, payable to C. H. Hempleman is charged as wages paid at filter.
Further, the waterworks department ledger shows that the following amounts were paid out and charged to construction as wages:
Warrant No. 950 for \$1659.18 payable to C. E. Bisbee,
