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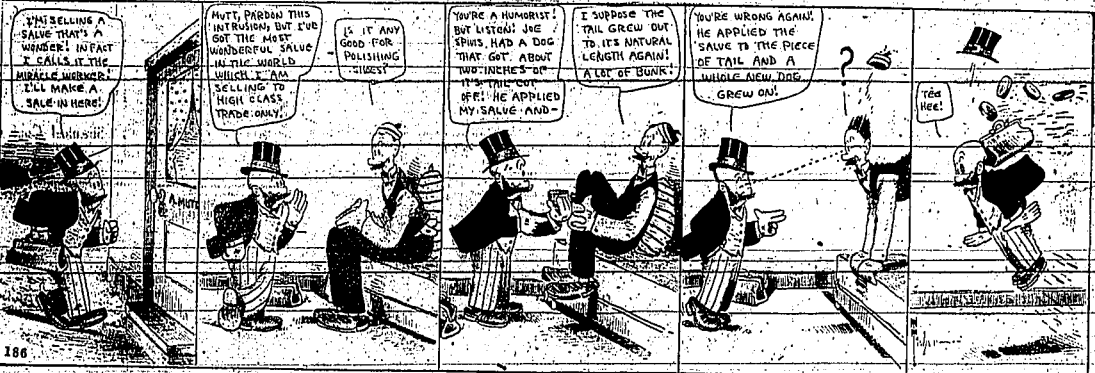

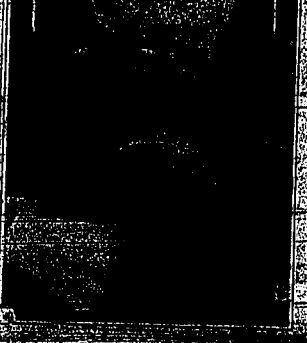

MIDDLE OF THE ROAD.

The middle-of-the-road policy in highway construction is advocated by the Times-Register of Idaho Falls as the most practical course for Idaho road builders, in discussing a choice of types.

Claiming that the expensive, hard-surface roads of California are not beginning the break-up under the pounding of heavy truck wheels, the Idaho Falls paper suggests a "happy medium" between the hard surface road and the coarse gravel type, which it says does not seem to be satisfactory. A substantial roadbed, well established drainage and a covering of screened gravel, is held up as the type likely to prove most satisfactory for the money.

Noting that a ramp across the falls at the present mile type, the Times-Register urges the less expensive kind as giving the greatest good to the greatest number.

In the present situation, any suggestion will be heard with interest, even to the recently announced successful experiment with cinders and refuse at Sky Lake (type of which some may smile but which, nevertheless, bears investigation).

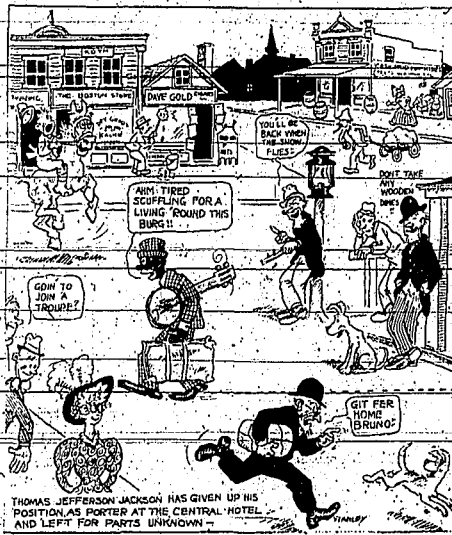

Judge Ensign on yesterday ordered the injunction to restrain the city from shutting off consumers' water for non-payment of cost of meter be dissolved. This means that the next administration will enforce the meter charge against your wishes by shutting off your water. Each consumer of water will be required to pay \$20.00.

TO THE VOTERS OF TWIN FALLS:

I opposed being nominated for mayor for reasons given the committee prior to my nomination.

I have not withdrawn for the reason that the sentiment of the Taxpayers seems to me to be decidedly against the installation of water meters at this time, and because this meets my personal views, and for the reason that if I did withdraw I would leave this class without a representative candidate for mayor.

It is only justice to you that I state that my personal plans for the future are not mature, and if elected and my personal plans interfered with the duties of the office, I would resign, whether that was one day or one year, after election.

If elected I would use my influence to abandon the proposed water meter system with a minimum loss to the city, believing a reasonable lump sum loss at this time preferable to the continued burden that

would be assumed by the Taxpayers and water users for installation, inspection, reading, repairing, destruction by freezing, increased cost to user and extra office and accounting force made necessary by the system.

I would use my influence to see that as many of the present City departments were abolished as would be in keeping with good business management and that as many of those remaining as possible were left under the supervision of one man.

Many ordinances now in force are not formulated in accordance with the best interests of our people as a whole and I would use my influence to see that all ordinances regulating the business conduct of our citizens and management of the affairs of this city that are not in keeping with the best business interests of a growing community such as ours, were repealed and more suitable ones instituted.

The present filter plant is inadequate to do this unless we can stop useless waste of water during the hot summer months.

There are two ways by which enough filtered water can be supplied during these summer months:

First: We could install a clear well at a cost of \$65,000.00, scrap the meters and have no control over the waste of water. Or,

Secondly: We could retain the meters, stopping the waste of water.

We believe it unwise to scrap the meters and then turn round and invest \$65,000.00 in a clear well.

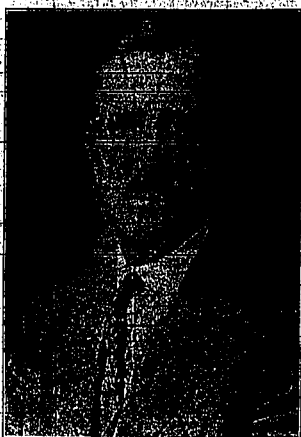
But we do believe that the entire cost of the meters should be paid by the water system and NOT BY INDIVIDUALS and that all those who have paid for meters should be reimbursed.
