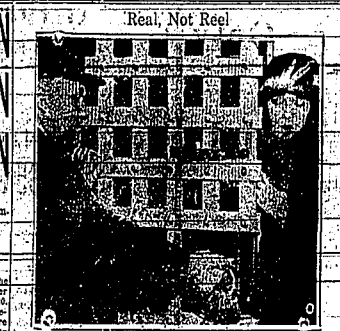

With the usual reverence for many occasions the different degrees of Odd Fellowship yesterday celebrated the one hundred and second anniversary of the establishment of the order in America.

Case Against Hertz Et Al

Holding that Fred F. Hertz was the owner of the A. H. Hertz and that the mortgage given by him in his alleged interest as partner in the firm was not without legal force and that a clause mortgaging the premises was without legal force except insofar as it covered the first lien of the mortgage, Judge P. The court held that the mortgage on the land in question and the clause mortgaging the same were applied to the factors of the case, the total amount involved aggregated about \$500.
