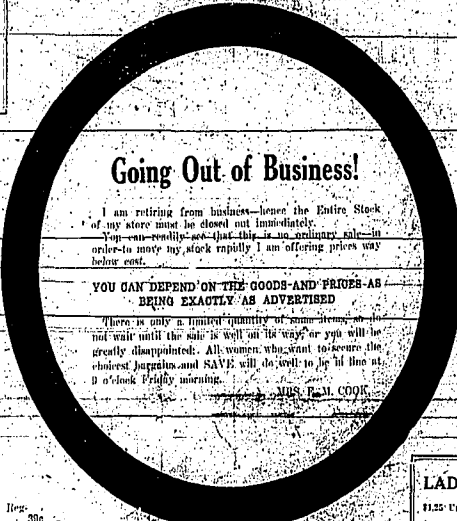

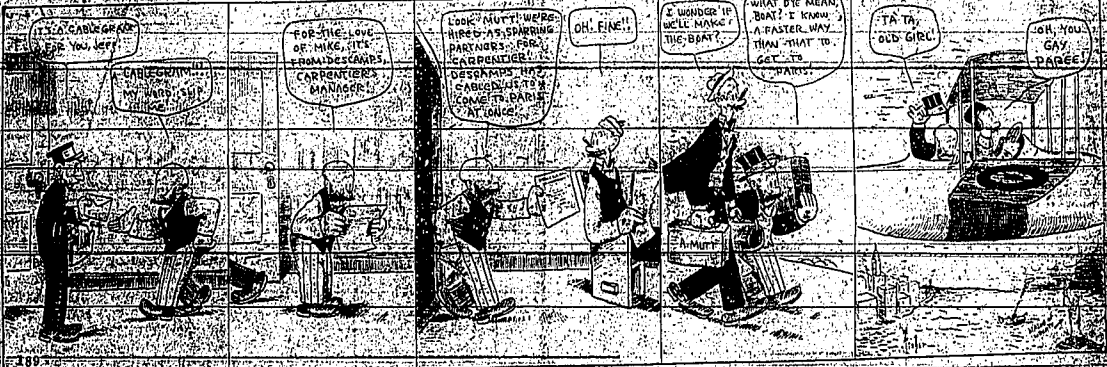

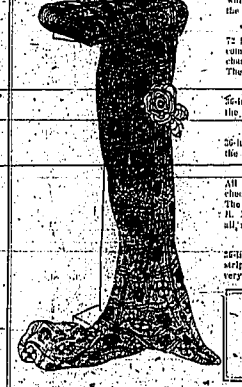

**BLAME RETAIL BUTCHER FOR PRICE LEVEL**

Grover and Fackler Claim They're Not Responsible for Prices Still Holding Up.

CHICAGO, April 26.—Retail butchers are now dipping their tails in the water.

They are clinging now to the low level of a vendible market, from those who produce livestock and prepare it for the market.

With prices of both cattle and hogs down to pre-war levels, the retail butcher's margin is up 200 percent.

It is this "margin" which is selling only great profit from the kind of livestock which is available to him in close touch with market conditions, intervened by the United Producers' association.

While prices of choice beef steers dropped to the lowest point in the last decade, there has been an advance of from 1 to 2 cents in the last few weeks for the best grade of beef.

The advance in beef fluctuations was explained by butchers who said there had been a deterioration of the demand due to the scarcity. Butchers had been selling more than they could handle, and that as soon as the demand was felt, it had an immediate effect on retail and wholesale markets.
