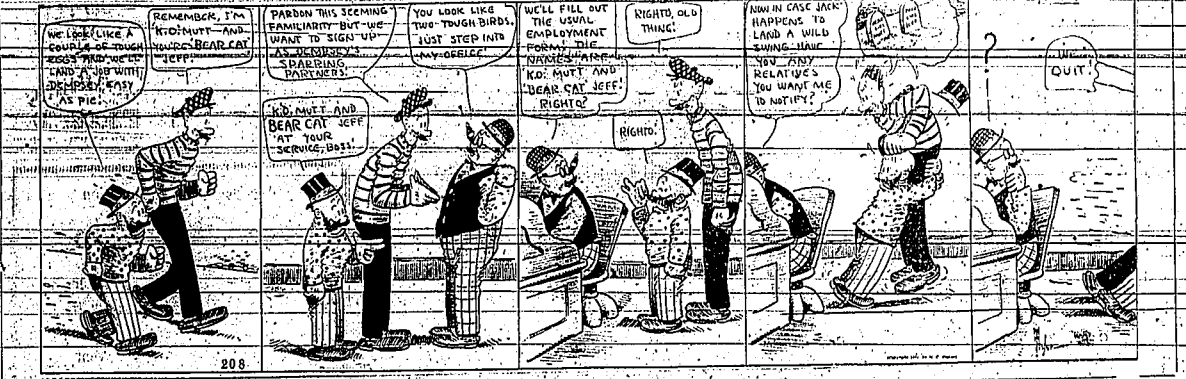

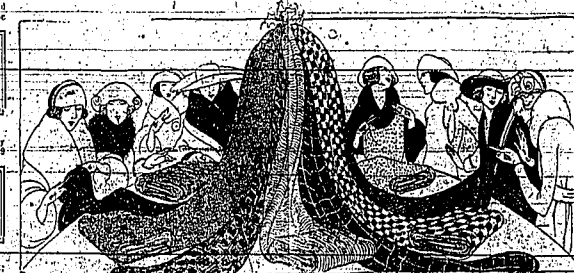

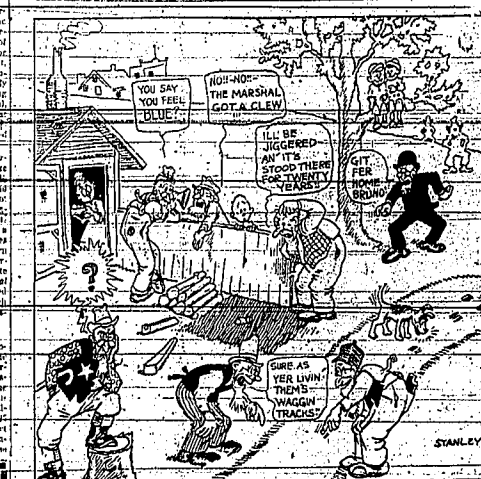

In rates had imposed an excessive and unfair burden upon products shipped from Idaho as compared with products hauled shorter distances, because of the distance which Idaho products are transported and through out of proportion the trade differential between producing districts established under former law and short haul rates (see Exhibit 'C').

The percentage increase does not bear a true relation to the actual increase in the cost of traffic on Idaho products, and imposes the heaviest burden upon those industries which produce a light-tonnage per acre (see Exhibit 'C').

As long as the 1910 railroad law and the present method of administration remain in effect, the industries referred to, are in danger of serious impairment and even of destruction.

At the end of the discussion, the Idaho State Farm Bureau adopted the following resolution:

Resolved, That the Idaho State Farm Bureau request the Senators and Representatives from Idaho to disregard the principles underlying the Transportation Act of 1910, and take a view to determining whether a modification of the law and its administration may be made to the end that the unreasonable and unjust burdens which have been placed upon all of the industries of Idaho may be removed.

The Farm Bureau hopes that it may have your earnest cooperation in this investigation and is an effort to accomplish the same burdens placed upon our Idaho industries.

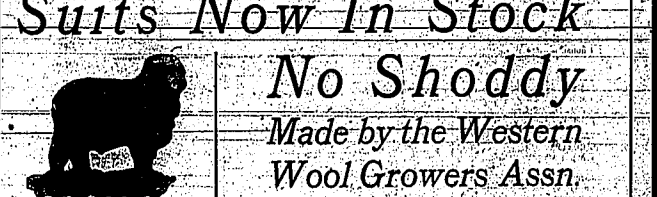

Clara Historical Data to Show an Alleged World Plot Against Germany.

Former Kaiser William of Germany has written for private distribution a book in which he attempts to show that England was responsible for the World War.
