ATLANTA, June 17.—(U. P.)—All training activities for Jack Dempsey were suddenly suspended today on orders of Jack's new physician.


No explanation was given for the sudden change in the champion's program. Rumors attached that Dempsey was troubled with the light work which had been suspended in place of the regular training.
