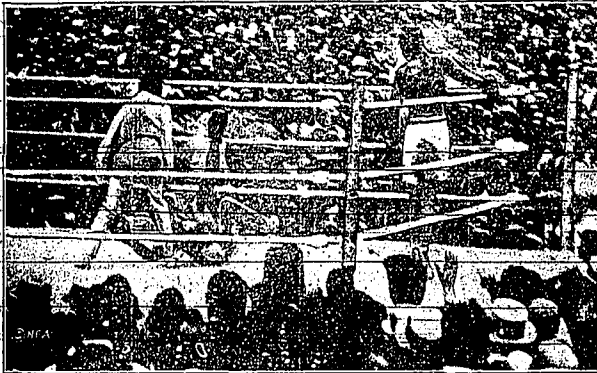


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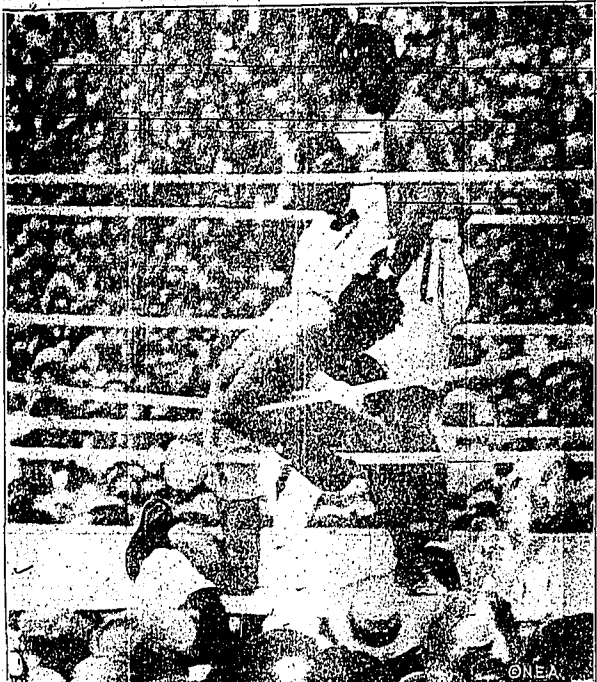

Miss Williams of Memphis, Zinner of Idaho Vice Pres. East, Is Defeated

1921 MOBILE, Ia., July 6.—Miss Charlotte Williams, 1910, superintendent of Chicago county schools and the highest paid woman county superintendent in the United States, was nominated for president of the National Education Association by the nominating committee today. Her nomination was "unanimously" passed upon on the third ballot taken by the committee. It amounts to election without debate on Friday, the closing day of the convention. In the nomination of Miss Williams the N. E. A. recognizes for the first time the rural teacher. Miss Williams plans an extensive rural school campaign as part of the association. Among influences behind Miss Williams are the state, individuals. Miss Olive Jones of New York City was seriously defeated in the selection of Miss Williams. Miss Carolina S. Adams of Richmond, Va., was nominated for treasurer. H. H. Mink of Port Dodge was named full-time director. Eleven vice-presidents nominated were: E. C. Oberholzer, Oklahoma; P. J. Engstrom, 11, Utah; Wilhelmina Van de Groot, California; Annie Webb-Holmes, Texas; and L. J. Collins, Minnesota.

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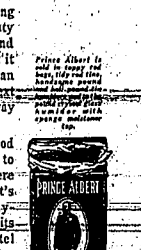
