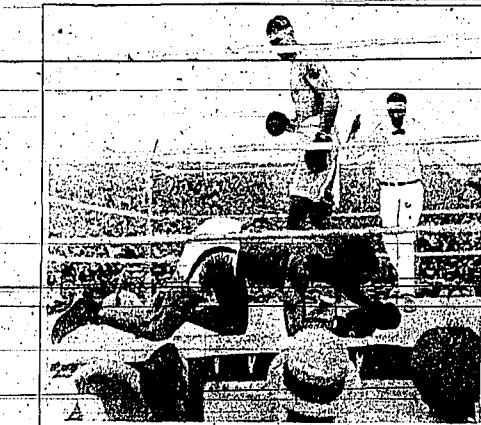
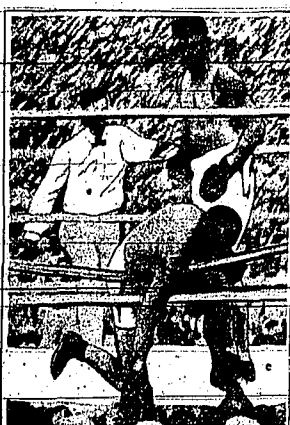


THE STORY—IN PICTURES—OF CARPENTIER'S DOWNFALL



Here is the beginning of the end—Georges Carpentier, knocked into the ropes, hanging there helplessly out. It was the first sign of Jack Dempsey's victory, coming quickly upon the heels of the Frenchman's surprisingly good showing in the second round and the many good punches he put over, in spite of Dempsey's overwhelming rush. In the third round, Georges was so quickly and easily wobbled by Dempsey's

punching in the clinches, he suffered his first real knockdown at Dempsey's hands (shown in the center picture). Quick as a flash Dempsey hooked a left to Georges' head and crashed over a right to the heart, the Frenchman falling face downward near the ropes; for a moment he rested on his knees and elbows, rolled over and came up under a coat of white. A moment later it was all over and Carpentier was

knocked out. The third picture shows Herbert Harry Erlich and Dempsey himself reaching down to lift up the beaten challenger. Dempsey had put over a right-hand blow to the heart and a left hook to the jaw, and followed with a lightning left—a left to the body and a right to the jaw. Georges tried vainly to rise, but he had to be helped to his feet after referee Egan had counted the fatal ten over him.
