LONDON, July 12.—The Irish peace delegation headed by Lemass De Valera arrived here this evening.

The delegation, which represents the Dublin and Cork franchises, will open negotiations with the government next Friday.

LONDON, July 12.—Violence continued in the north of Ireland early today, resulting in which became effective yesterday.

"I do not believe my son or those who have been fighting for Ireland can be as indifferent as to accept any terms other than absolute freedom," Mr. Whitworth said in an interview.

"We want no more of English freedom; that might be some agreement, but it would not be satisfactory to both sides."

Interspersed in his work in the United States, Mr. Whitworth, a friend of Ireland, has won over, reluctantly, saying she had rather wait for the final settlement.

## 75c OF EACH DOLLAR IN TAXES SPENT FOR WAR, FIGURES SHOW

Washington, July 10.—War, past, present and future, cost the United States nearly \$4,000,000,000 in the fiscal year ended July 1, treasury department records showed today.

Seventy cents out of each dollar of the taxpayers went into bills arising from war, preparation for war,

and other expenditures at great or a greater percentage of the total.

Tax collections for the year totalled \$31,152,920,000 while disbursements for war purposes amounted to \$3,850,028,000 without taking into account millions paid out in pensions by the pension bureau, by the war risk bureau and a score of other expenditures by departments which are not generally classified as war conducting branches of the government.
