


Record Trip to Salt Lake and Return On Tuesday



PROVE THE GUILT, PUNISH THE GUILTY

According to Chairman Lasker of the new shipping board, President Harding was unwise and distressed when the facts as to the financial chaos in the shipping board were laid before him.

Anxieties and distress are hardly strong enough words to express the feelings of the nation's long-suffering and overburdened taxpayers.

The situation as disclosed by Lasker makes a chapter in governmental history which for simplicity, pedantry, inefficiency and utter disregard of the public interest, is without precedent.

Whether or not the element of downright dishonesty is also present, Lasker does not say. But he gets pretty close to it when he makes this significant statement: "The books of the board are not, in a commercial sense, books at all. If a purposeful effort had been made to keep the books so as to cheat and defraud our government and the country, they could have been kept in a very different manner."

Hundreds of millions of dollars of losses in the industry are involved in the financial wreck.

Syndromic and persistent deception of the public and Congress by officials and employees of the shipping board is a feature of the tragic situation, which in some aspects is the worst of all.

For example, when Congress appropriated the sum of \$39,000,000 for the old shipping board for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1921, it was told that exceed the board's operating expenses. As a matter of fact the cost of these operations was \$150,000,000, nearly four times as much.

The vast sum of nearly \$300,000,000 has got to be made up this year, at a time when every effort of the government is being directed toward economy.

Lasker very charitably absolves certain officials of the old shipping board from blame for the keep-keeping system on the ground that "the system has been in use from the start, beginning with pressure and continued in incompetence."

Well, if the officials of the old shipping board are not responsible for continuing an inadequate war system for nearly three years after the war ended, who is responsible?

It is obvious that the responsibility, for this recklessness, if not criminal waste of public money lies somewhere.

"Let's have a congressional investigation," did we hear some body suggest?

For goodness sake ignore just a farce as that! A congressional investigation would mean that at the end of a year or so we would get a partition report which would be absolutely ineffective.

This seems to be a case which calls for investigation and action by a federal grand jury.

BLONDS SUFFER MOST

Blonds suffer more than brunettes from "summer heat," says Twin Falls doctor. The reason? Because blonds belong in the cold north, brunettes near the equator.

REGROUPING OF BUREAUS, PLAN

Harding to Recommend a Move to Secure Economy and Efficiency Gains.

WASHINGTON.—President Harding is about to submit to the Senate a plan for regrouping of the various bureaus of the government.

The plan is expected to include the creation of a department of public welfare.

Transfer of the prohibitory enforcement machinery from the treasury department to the department of justice.

Centralization of all forest service activities under the department of justice.

Reduction or possible splitting of the bureau of fisheries.

The plan which is being drafted by Walter F. Brown, who is retained by the cabinet and submitted to the joint congressional committees on reorganization, will make additional changes and then will be sent to both houses of congress for further consideration.

Washington, acting as a clearing center, will be given certain authority to coordinate the proposal to create a secretary of national defense which would draw both the army and navy into its fold.

Expected opposition to this proposal may result in this plan being held in abeyance until a later date.

Mr. Brown, who is retained at a salary of \$12,000 a year, will be a rather reluctant guide, will be

vigorously opposed by the president in the reorganization program. Pres-

ident Coolidge, however, has

already agreed to the plan.
