

SHERMAN ASKS FOR HELP FOR POWER PROBE

**Sends—Letter—Here—Through
Mayor Asking Co-operation
of City.**

The appeal of Mayor Eugene Sherman, Jr., of the Southern Idaho Electric Light & Power Users' Association, directed to Twin Falls through Mayor J. C. Tamm, was received by the state commissioners at their meeting last night, review the company's hearing from the point of view of Mayor Sherman, who asked that the association accept presentation of the legal position in the valuation asked by the Idaho Power Company.

It would appear from the statement of Mr. Sherman that the association, which half of the amount asked has been contributed, "The association received \$22,000 and can only afford to contribute \$10,000,"

which follows:

Dear Mr. McElroy:

I received some time ago your letter in the few words of Twin Falls to you was unlikely that the city council would join in the Southern Idaho Association's action.

The work, if done at all, would be done by an organization such as this, the association, the city council, the mayor, etc.,

or the city commission, etc.

We regret very much that throughout his co-operation with us, our real financial condition, that the Government of Twin Falls may also feel itself hard pressed financially. We are glad that the threshing machine men and the farmers have finally threshed out their grievances by the oratory route. Statistics made public by the National Industrial conference board in recent press dispatches will cause no little surprise to those people, which include most of the public—when held—believe the country was back on a pre-war basis, or at least close to it. While living costs as a whole were reduced 21 per cent during the year ending July 1, they were still up 61 per cent higher than living costs in 1914. The cost of clothing even went up slightly during June, says the report, which fixes the increase at 1.5 per cent. Food was the only item lowered during June, this drop being about a third of one per cent. The report places the valuation of the 1914 dollar as equal to \$.93 of the 1921 dollar. The main thing, though, is to remember that 21 per cent reduction in the last year, which, if continued, will put us back to normal before long.

We only know that much of the world is in trouble and that we, in spite of our own troubles, have been able to assist them. That is merit enough for us.

It should be a great source of pleasure to Americans that this far their nation has not been found wanting in time of dire need, nor grown weary in well-doing.—Exchange.
