

## IRELAND CLAIMS BRITISH PEACE OFFER FRAUD

SINN FEIN  
MAY ISSUE  
MANIFESTOCharges Double Cross From  
Lloyd George—England  
To Apply Punitive

HAMILTON, Aug. 20.—Sir Sin Fein today seriously considered issuing manifesto to the world, pointing out the alleged unfairness of the British peace offer.

Members of the Dail Eireann in private conference discussed this situation, according to *Irish News*.

The issuance of such a manifesto would be considered a preliminary to a resumption of hostilities.

The speech of Sir Edward Carson, president of the Unionist party, before the House of Commons yesterday, was interpreted by Lloyd George's speech in the opinion of

*Irish News*, the republican, who has been "double-crossed" by the little brother.

"This," he said, "was the logical outcome of the sudden switch of Sinn Fein from its determination to accept the British offer to its present position."

The all-party conference, held July 21, the republican leaders, influenced by the favorable attitude of the British government, had decided in Ireland to support the peace proposal.

The peace offer, accepted by the Dail Eireann, was disclosed in a speech of Lloyd George's terms, "but when the Valence announced that the British government had accepted the peace offer, not only did it differ from the original proposal, but it also differed from the actual terms of the peace offer."

The "present offer does not meet the demands of the people of Ireland," which General Jemius, the peace maker, inferred, it was said, and John Redmond, now chairman of the National Executive Committee of the Nationalist Party, as well as Ireland's "Wise Impresario of the actual terms."

LONDON, Aug. 20.—Civil war was imminent if Sinn Fein surrenders unconditionally, said Lloyd George, in his speech to the press yesterday.

The present negotiations, fall according to many indications, here to determine whether or not Ireland will be independent.

Lloyd George won himself the support of all facets by his speech.


