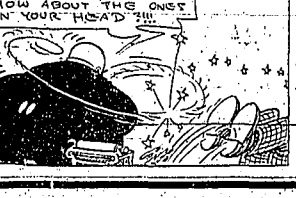

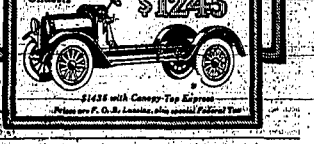

POSSESSION ILLEGAL IN EVERY CASE

Judge Babcock Holds Constitutional Amendment Leaves Out the Prohibition Statute Intact.

Possession of intoxicants is held to be illegal whether the purpose of the possession is for sale or not, according to Judge W. A. Babcock, who this morning overruled the decision of the Supreme Court in the Mexican-alleged case of cases.

Point raised by defense was that while a statute enacted prior to the passage of the prohibition constitutional amendment prohibited the possession of liquor for any purpose, this statute was amended by the amendment which simply forbade the carrying of intoxicating liquor for the purpose of sale.

World Hates Wide Effort

That the view of the matter if upheld, will have a far-reaching effect on prohibition in this country was suggested by Judge Babcock in overruling the demurrer.

Such ruling, it is suggested in some quarters, if adopted, might prevent the passage of any prohibition amendment.

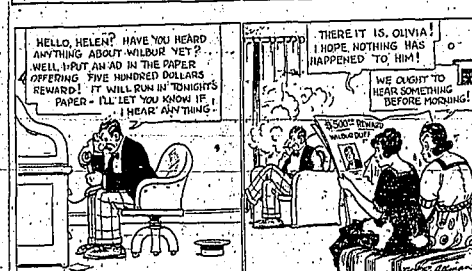
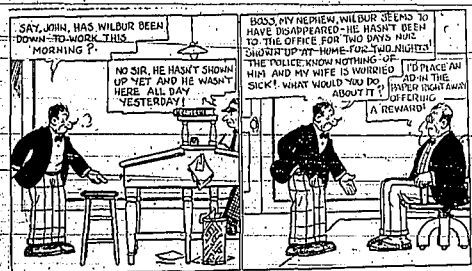

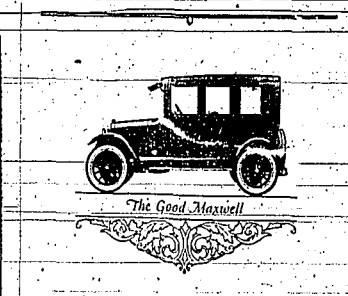
