THE JOY OF WORK

The one word "joy" in this caption will bring forth praise from the majority of The Times readers.

GIVE THE HEART A CHANCE

During his long public career William Jennings Bryan has made many remarks which had no particular bearing on politics. Recently he said, "A well rounded education requires education of the body, the mind, and the heart. The heart is the most important."

"There was a world of truth in that remark. We have schools and graded knowledge to educate the mind. We have physical culture, physicians and sports to educate the body."

"It would be a good plan to give the young a rest from rules of grammar, mathematics and science and take a few months off to teach the Golden Rule. Especially, there should be a night school for the grown-ups."

"Business depression is the big problem with us today. Brains are concentrated on it—trying to run it by in-creased dollars, such as tariff, regulations, schemes and cut-offs. Business is but a reaction for the period of good, prospering, by nearly all of us, in one form or another."

"The old law of compensation is at work. We are getting paid for our sins. It isn't an intellectual problem. What is needed is a change of heart—an outworn new attitude of tolerance and cooperation on the part of the whole nation."

"Such a change is coming, must come. When good times get here again, ecologists will laugh their brains, catch the course of business with lines that look like lightning flashes. They will reveal truths. But the chart will not show the underlying cause of the return to prosperity. The real cause will be a spiritual, but an outworn heart."

"We all seek happiness. What is it? A state of mind? Partly. A state of body? To a small extent. But real happiness is a condition of the heart."

"The philosophers have all recognized this. The great doctors in history—like Crass, Alexander, Napoleon and 'Bill of Germany'—have been all mind, no heart. The great constructive geniuses in history—like Solomon, Zoroaster, Confucius and Lincoln—have invariably been men of infinite heart."

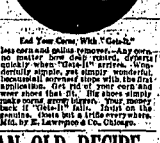
