STOPS HAYWORK

Great Britain Is The First Nation To Issue a Public Health Order Expected to Follow Soon.

LONDON, Nov. 18.—Great Britain has ordered immediate cessation of construction work on capital ships to prove her desire for carrying out the Hughes program. It was officially announced today.

After a sudden and unexpected announcement by the admiralty that it was being stopped on four new super-dreadnaughts, an official statement was issued to the effect that more was behind the thing, and to prove she is desirous of eliminating air resistance with the Hughes program.

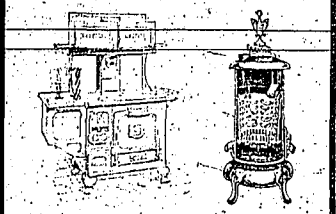

WHERE THE TROUBLE LIES

In a chat with the editor of "The Times," John E. Kellard, the noted actor who closed a two-night engagement at the Lavering last night, said that, there were three causes for the present financial condition of the country: railroad rates, the money power and congress.

He declared that until railroad rates came down, both freight and passenger, could the people expect times to again become normal. He also said that for every indication the money power of the country was holding the people in its grip and were it not for the Federal reserve act there would, no be the worst business panic in history as we know. "The banks, which are the money power, refuse to loan a dollar unless they get about ten dollars worth of security. This is one of the big reasons for the present financial stagnation." Mr. Kellard said that congress was not a little to blame because the country did not know what it was going to do.

In this last sentence he struck a note that has been bothering us for a long time. Over a year ago we were promised that if we would vote the Republican ticket we should have relief from the tax burden. Some of the orators went so far as to tell us that the party would be in power more than a month before the relief would be at hand. Congress has been in special session since the fourth of last March, to date none of us has grown limp-backed carrying around the extra money in our pocket books. There has been no tax relief bill passed and we doubt if there will be in the special session. The president learned yesterday that his present was worth little or nothing to the members of the house. There has been no great principle at stake during the last eight months at least as far as congress has been concerned. Every member knows that the people want tax reduction, yet none has come.

It is possible that Mr. Kellard struck the real truth when he said that the country was in the grip of the money power.

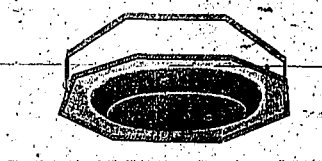
