UNWANTED WEEDS

The offender is hid in the courtroom before the police judge. The offender is a boy who has scarcely entered his teens. The center of attention is an older brother of the young criminal, who, with his arm about his brother, is pleading his case with all the warmth of his strong, young heart. And that appeal had upon a home-story that astonished all who heard him. Tears filled the officer's eyes as he stretched out his hand to the speaker when he had finished.

"What is my brother, and I know better than any one who has led him to do what he has done," said the young man. "I was reared in the same home and have met the same temptations and for a few years was about to go the road he has started. Then he went on to tell of the home life as the boys had found it—unattractive and dissipated surroundings, neglect and indifference towards the boy, young tendencies uncorrected, harshness and injustice towards them—and ending his arraignment, he said, 'We were unloved twins in the home life.'"

Then the speaker went on to tell the effect of his home life on himself when he was at his brother's age. He told of escapades and even thefts, which he said he had made right to the one wronged since he had started on a better life, and of the utter lack of the kind of home that would turn him toward a better way. "A good man took me under his care and counseled and advised me and set me by example and precept the principles of right that every boy needs to know," the young man said. "I began to see what life meant for the person who set his face to do right, and there was born in me a desire to be a noble man and fill a worthy place in life. I will not say that it was easy, for it was not always, but I have kept my decision, and I have already outgrown most of my past. I plead now for my brother, that he may be given into the care of some one who will give him the life I received. I want it definitely fixed that he shall no more come under the care of his home roof, for if he does he can not make good. But with a chance I believe my brother will make good."

Those who heard this young man speak understood in some way what it had cost him to lay bare his home life, and his own earlier mistakes, and admired him for his courage and good nature.

But what a charge against his parents! Unwanted words, the children a nuisance, a worry, an unpleasant burden. The parents longing for the free and easy life in which there is no responsibility, felt that the burden of their care and support was too heavy. Another mother said, in speaking with her neighbor about the care that children want, that her boy, a child of six or eight, gave her little trouble, for he was often out from the time he ate his breakfast until time to go to bed, but on the streets she knew. She did not even feel that she was responsible for the trouble. Where did the boy show? Why blame?

In every city and town and nearly a rural community you will find these "unwanted weeds" growing up into vice and immorality. What shall be the reward of those parents who neglect their offspring?

There is no work a woman can do outside of her home that will answer before God or men for the willful neglect of her children. Whether her time is spent in social services, in church and pleasure, in endless scrubbing and cleaning at home, or how ever it may be she is leaving the more important thing if she is neglecting her children.

The father who lets his business and pleasure crowd out his time for the children he has begotten so that they grow up without the father's counsel and advice, who has given, has fallen short in his responsibility. Let our children be cultivated plants, not weeds.

### DAIRY FACTS

#### COW TESTING IS IMPORTANT

Much Progress Has Been Made in Testing Inferior Bulls With High-Class Animals.

(Reviewed by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

Numerous examples of the valuable work being done by cow-testing stations are reported by representatives of these organizations west of the western office of the dairy division of the United States Department of Agriculture.

According to the reports, marked progress has been made in testing inferior bulls with high-grade registered animals. Six of the testing associations which were in existence in California and one in Washington have ranked the 100 best purebred bull sires, having eliminated all sires less than 90 per cent. Another 100 per cent association was ranked in the list in January, and several others are getting near this mark.

The National (C.A.) association has only two scrub bulls left. The dairy department of the local farm bureau of the county in which the association is located has a plan for an annual practical bull test, the first of which was held several months ago. Young bulls out of 400-pound dams and older sires are compared to this with by breeders and by dairymen, with a view to disposing of bulls which they have used as long as they are in their own hands. The sale was the best of the testing 25 purebred bulls into the country, and the association hopes to do this same to eliminate all scrub bulls from the county and to keep the dairy stock supplied with good bulls in the future.
