WHERE THE RESPONSIBILITY LIES

A recent editorial in The Times on "Juvenile Delinquency," based on a statement made by Probation Officer Allen, has brought forth this question from a number of our readers: "Don't you think that there is any good in the boys and girls of today?"

We are glad that it is but one reader that has asked the question, otherwise we might think that the purpose of the editorial was misunderstood. Don't you think that there is any good in the boys and girls of today? The willful doubt, on the part of boys and girls to go the wrong path is so slight that it hardly need be considered; likewise the much talked of hereditary trait for sin is so small that it is hardly worth considering.

The over fifteen years it has been our privilege, and surely many times, to make a rather close study of juvenile delinquency and from our observation we feel safe in saying that where one boy or girl goes wrong through hereditary traits, ninety-nine go wrong through environment. The temptation to do wrong, to follow the primrose path are growing greater year by year and at the same time the home influence, yay and even the church influence, seems to be growing less. Every minister in the United States today realizes in part at least, the dangers that surround youth, and to the credit of the big majority of them, it may be said that they are trying to combat it with all their heart and soul.

We know that there are cases where the child is not to blame, in fact the child is not to blame in the majority of those who go wrong; it lies elsewhere else.

Some years ago the writer sat in a famous juvenile court. A number of cases was heard. Finally a boy of about 12 faced the court on the charge of truancy. Here is his story, almost word for word:

"After father gets his breakfast and goes to work I get up and get breakfast for my little brother and myself, then I get him dressed and off to school, then I have to sweep up the house and wash the dishes, and then—well it's late and so I don't like to go to school."

"Where is your mother?" asked the court in a not unkindly tone.

The boy hung his head, tears started from his eyes as with a half sob he said, "She's dead."

MISSIONARY IN LECTURE GIVES HIS POSITION

Rev. Quinn Lecturer on Catholic Church Mission Closes Tonight.

Before a large congregation at St. Edwards Catholic church Sunday night Sr. Fr. Quinn, pastor missionary, gave the closing address of his lecture on the Catholic Church Mission organization as the true, apostolic organization of Jesus Christ on earth, discussing the subject from a historical, theological and scriptural point of view. The address will close Tuesday.

In his preliminary remarks Father Quinn said that he had been invited to give a series of lectures on the subject of the Catholic Church Mission organization. He declared his belief in the sincerity of the conversion of the subject, and stated that on this ground he would say with the reason for the faith in him if it is not that they will appreciate, they could part good friends.

Quinn announced that he would quote scriptures to furnish his contention that Jesus Christ founded a definite organization to teach all the truth that he had taught and to teach them until they divine nature until the end of time. He said that as Christ taught authoritatively, an apostle, an organization of the church was necessary so that there could be no division of opinion on such subjects as whether or not the subject was a true convert, whether there were solemn sacraments, two sacraments, baptism at all, whether baptism was necessary for salvation or whether Jesus Christ was God or merely a good man with more or less inspiration. He contended that each, sincere and religious man after honest search of the scriptures declared on all these questions and that we will continue to divide on them until the end of time, unless Christ had intended a definite body with authority to determine the meaning of different tests or scriptures authoritatively as he would determine them on earth. He said that the church was a teaching body from the beginning as the first line of scripture was written and continues before it was all completed in the same book.

The speaker contended that there but one church which had authority to divine authority to make such infallible decisions and that was the Catholic church which he also stated was the only church which had continuity and the only one which was absolutely sure of all past and essential doctrine. He asserted that the Catholic church could trace its history directly to the apostles and the papacy from the first XV century.

Quinn said that corrupt men had arisen within the priesthood from time to time, giving grave scandal, as Jesus had appeared in the original apostolic church, but in both that the purity of teaching doctrine was identified with the lives of certain men who had the practice, who they preached was to "confuse the human element in the divine foundation," declared the speaker.

STATE WELFARE COMMISSIONER CHARGES THAT COUNTIES SEND SANE PATIENTS TO THE ASYLUM

BOISE, Nov. 21.—The first gain of what is said to be the best of years in the state and the various counties was first Saturday when David H. Barr, state commissioner of public welfare, addressed a letter to all judges of the state having pending in their courts cases of insane patients asking their cooperation in keeping them out of the asylums and sending them to the county jails instead.

The institutions are becoming an expense to the state, and it is considered unnecessary to start an investigation in light of the cases of the increase in commitments to the asylums.

Mr. Barr, however, said that the increase in commitments to the asylums is due to the fact that the state has failed to fund, in any degree, the asylums who are unable to care for the insane.

"The surprising thing," he says, "is that practically all of these insane patients have come from county jails, farms, contrary to the provisions of section 134, Idaho Compiled Statutes. This means that the county jails are being used as places for the insane."
