JUDGE DENIES HE ISSUED ORDER

People of Colorado Are Divided on What Should Be Done With Woman With Five Children Sterilization Suggested.

DENVER, Nov. 27.—Doubt that he ordered Mrs. C. C. Cook to undergo a sterilization operation to prevent the birth of any more children, was made here today by Judge Royal Graham of the juvenile court. The statement in regard to Mrs. Cook's alleged case was made in a hearing held in Judge Graham's court.

"I made no comment on the question of an operation when it was suggested by some medical students who testified in the case Saturday," Judge Graham said. "However, I did say later that such an order might be entered if the conditions made it necessary and with the consent of the parties concerned."

Judge Graham said he had no desire to force Mrs. Cook to submit to an operation or give up her five children. "Unless satisfactory conditions at the Colorado home are improved the children will be taken from their parents," he said.

Meanwhile, in the juvenile home of Cookville, the mothers of the five children declared she would kill anyone who attempted to operate on her or take her children from her.

"They wouldn't get past that front door," she cried, waving a long, thin, thin knife.

"We are caring for our children at night. The court is down on my head and for me to get into it 15 years ago," Mrs. Cook said.

"That's the only reason I am here for bringing this affair into court."

The audience's tone is typical of the shanties that line the banks of the Platte river here. It is about an acre as the quarters of the average foreign laborer. Neighbors whose houses are similar to Cookville's declared the children are well raised and that they would support the parents if efforts were made to break up the family.

At 11 o'clock an Italian interpreter, witnesses between \$25 and \$75 a month, he said.

News of the case aroused the question among the women and workers were divided on the question of the justice of a sterilization operation. Most of them condemned it.

Denver pastors denounce such procedure. Other prominent Coloradans said if there was mental weakness in the family, both parents should be sterilized.
