## OF ANCIENT DAYS

Much Is Told in Collection of Old Documents.

**Legal Papers Recovered by Archaeologists Reveal Life of People During Early Christian Era.**

What is described as one of the most important collections of ancient documents ever discovered, consisting of more than 300 legal papers dealing with the reigns of the Roman emperors Augustus, Tiberius, Caligula and Claudius, has been recovered by Arthur F. Kell, of the University of Michigan. Professor Kell spent some time in Egypt to study the ancient documents. The collection is believed to be unique because it records the life of people during early Christian era.

The records, obtained by Professor Kell, consist of part of the first century of the Christian era, and were discovered four months ago.

They are written on papyrus and are chiefly in Greek, but also contain some Latin. They have been recovered with sand and will be cleaned and made legible before they are brought up against a very different problem.

Even today nobody knows exactly where the greatest sea routes were, and what prevented them from reaching the bottom in the deepest parts. A theory accredited by scientists is that before man learned to make ships he did not know how to make a boat, because the pressure of the water is so great that specific gravity is zero.

Another theory holds that when ships in the deepest parts of the ocean never reach bottom, but float suspended in the water at a depth below which their weight is equal to the buoyancy of the water.

In this branch of nautical science wonderful instruments are used. Attached to the leads of the sounding line are weights called plumb bobs, which are suspended on piano wire, and specially constructed cups, which close automatically and hold up samples of the ocean bottom. They are also used to catch fish, which are suspended upon the lead, touched by the lead is at once recorded, and are used in all oceanographic cable ships, which must be used to record the depth of the ocean bottom.

## SOUND THE OCEAN

Scientific Investigation is Now Going On.

**Strong Probability That the Wonders of the Deep Will Be Revealed Very Shortly.**

Dredgers encountered in deep-sea sounding, as disclosed by a marine engineer writing in the London "Engineering Daily Mail."

Deep-sea sounding last year, he writes, has been a success. With a ship a day has been made up from land the real work begins.
