The suspension of work ordered by officials of the International conference of the United Mine Workers and sanctioned by the miners through a referendum vote, will continue until the first of April.

BLOCKADE IS STARTED IN DOOZE RING

Prohibition Bureau is Planning Twentieth Century Boozers Blockade With Aid of All Modern Means.

Wireless Communications Will be Used to Run Down Violators of the Eighteenth Amendment.

WASHINGTON, March 21.—A twenty-first century boozing blockade, composed of airplanes, submarines and special motorized patrol boats by wireless, is being set up by the prohibition bureau.

Plans are maturing, officials declared here today, for a ten thousand mile "wall" about the United States to keep the flow of alcohol out.

With this blockade, 100 per cent of alcoholic production, officials are confident the only source of supply of "booze" liquor will be completely cut off and that drinking this will be the end of that section.

In working out this plan, Commissioner John A. Haynes already has outlined the use of airplanes over the Florida and Texas borders.

Special fleets of minesubmersibles and other highly equipped forces are being trained in New Jersey and New England coast lines presently training the majority of submersibles from that section.

In certain sections of Twin Falls many of the poplar trees are being cut down on the assumption that the roots are raising the concrete of the sewerage tract along these streets to crack and break, but this is absolutely untrue because the roots of a tree will never penetrate concrete. We are inclined to the opinion that the roots of these trees will not so readily crack and break. It seems like a shame to kill these trees and remove them when they make such a splendid shade. If they must be removed they should be left a few years and other trees planted in between them so that we will have some shade when the cottonwood trees are removed.

Bankrupt shops and financial swindlers have within the last four years defrauded the investors of America to the extent of more than \$5,000,000,000, according to the New York correspondent of the Washington D. C. Post. Investigation by the Post's correspondent developed the fact that an amount in excess of \$700,000,000 was extracted from gullible investors by sharpers during 1921. Of these figures are to be accepted as anywhere near accurate, it means a few centing loss for every man, woman and child in the United States of about \$7 for the year. "Honeyed stock" operations are blamed for much of this. A campaign is being launched by an organization of legitimate bankers and brokers, backed by the New York Stock Exchange, the American Bankers' Association and the New York Bankers' Association, to blot out fraud in the financial system of the country.


