

CONFERENCE MAY PREVENT COAL STRIKE

Union Officials and Coal Operators Will Meet Tomorrow For Important Conference—Miners Unions and Operators May Bring About Settlement of Differences Throughout Nation and Stop Strike.

CHICAGO, March 25.—Conference between coal operators and union officials to be held here tomorrow may settle the operators' refusal to agree to a truce to prevent the threatened strike war April 1. It was viewed here today as the most important step in the preparations for the strike.

Preparations were under way for the meeting between Frank Parrington, top boss of the Illinois miners and operators.

Parrington, in accord with an agreement made with mine operators, suggested the date of the conference. The operators immediately accepted the proposal of the union side.

It was not expected in mine circles here that peace would directly result from the conference. It was believed peace features would be thrown out which may result in new negotiations of a wider scope before April 1.

However, operators and union officials in Illinois, in conference tomorrow, may make plans for drawing unions and operators of other states into a meeting to discuss a general peace.






