## TOWNER-STERLING-BILL

Ideals are epidemic, as well as influenza. Some are a ghost which throws stones or sets the house on fire. And behold, all over the country comes the report of "diseases." Someone who has a reason for not wanting the children of today, well educated sees a mythical objection to the Towner-Sterling bill, now before congress, which provides for a department of Education and a chief who is a member of the Cabinet, and all over the country little men of little minds echo the cry of "paternalism."

The Towner-Sterling bill requires these three things in a state before it can receive the "paternal" federal aid to education provided in the bill:

1. A public school opportunity of not less than 24 weeks.
2. Compulsory attendance at some school, public or private, for at least 24 weeks in the year of all children between 7 and 14.
3. English as the basic language of instruction in all schools, public and private, in the common branches.

The man who comes out in the open and says those provisions are wrong or un-American, or vicious may have courage, if not sense.

As a matter of sober fact, there are no real objections to the bill, even by those who don't want it! The only persons who don't want it are the people who have always fought education, who see in the education of the masses the end of spiritual and thus civil tyranny. But the people of the United States as a whole want education, believe in education, demand education, know that education is the only and only salvation for both the individual and the nation.

Talk is cheap. Action takes thought and time. When the Towner-Sterling bill passes it will pass because enough newspapers, clergymen, educators, influential men and common, ordinary, everyday citizens have printed, talked and written about their convictions both to and at their respective legislatures.

You who read this have a representative in Congress just the right to address two senators. Three recent stamps and your convictions seem to these gentlemen will add in bringing to your schools your opportunity, your children the same federal aid which has helped you and other communities in roads, in agriculture, in postal facilities, in reclamation, in mining methods, in forestry, in all the hundred and one ways in which Uncle Sam assists America to be better, abler and more prosperous citizens.

Do it now!

Mrs. Asquith is especially shocked by the drinking among our young people—the magnetic power of a flask of whisky, or synthetic gin at a dance.

She wouldn't be so emphatic now if she had visited us before prohibition and watched the drinking among folks in grill rooms or even at high school dances where the boys with the largest peg-top trousers spiced the punch.

Very few rum hounds will admit it. But there are few drinking now than before prohibition. Turn your memory back to saloon days, when midnight owl cars were riotous, road houses, bachelian, and drunken men staggering in streets were common.

Every conversation these days, if its last long enough, drifts around to booze. A favorite topic is the great number of people who never drank before prohibition but now take intense pride in being able to serve something with a kick.

"All this," says the rum hounds, "is due to Americans' resentment against having their personal liberty restrained by law."

If this reason is logical, most of us are philosophical miscreants.

Which we're not.

Personal liberty is restrained daily by hundreds of other laws—on traffic regulations, disease quarantine and prohibition of keeping pigs in city limits. These laws are accepted easily, as is matter of course.

This is the truth: The people who are drinking now won't be drinking twice as much if the saloons were back. The war left with highly strung nerves and terrific economic problems. This heritage is the cause of the widespread craving for liquor to soothe the nerves and make us forget economic problems we haven't the courage to face with clear brains.

Hum bugs seem unable to fit it through their heads that the prohibition law is here to stay. In the back of their brains lingers a delusion that dryness is only temporary—that somehow or other liquor will come back.

"Not whisky, just wine and beer," they say. Their subversive minds know that wine would be spiked high proof.

Whether the national constitution could be unimpaired by any process is doubtful. Supreme court might have something to say about that. Certainly it would require a majority vote of both houses of congress and both houses of 36 state legislatures.

Legitimized liquor is gone forever in the United States. Talk to the contrary is as futile as it isinine.

## DRUGLESS HEALING UNDER BAN OF S. S. MEDICAL ASS'N

Doctors Say Other Schools Try to Protect Medical and Pharmacy Students. Will Hillard With Other School—Dr. Weathers Has Paper on Cataracts

All shades of drugless healers are under the ban of the Northwestern Medical Association representing six counties at its recent meeting in Twin Falls. Last year, during and "the year against infiltration with them was unanimous. The banquet was largely attended and was declared a success in every way.

The medicals hold that there is a constant tendency to allow the drugless healers to grow in popularity and prosperity. In the part of the various schools of druggists, John, and thus in many cases they are not required to have degrees or even high school education.
