He will be accompanied by his wife, Mme. Joffre, and their two sons, Jean and Charles.



## SALMON LITIGATION TENDS TO CLOSE

The ruling of Judge T. Bailey Lee on the demurrer to the case filed by R. Glavin and others against the Salmon River Canal company, as given in the Times yesterday, marks a step in one of the clauses of suits that has fastened the Salmon trout in litigation for many years. In a great portion of the trout things are tending toward settlement, as a majority of the settlers have signed up with the company, but a considerable number of others have refused to do so and those are within their legal and moral rights until there is a meeting of minds, which shall bring about an agreement. Regarding the wisdom of their course, there is naturally a difference of opinion, especially between them and the company and bondholders.

Away back under the administration of Governor Frank H. Gooding the Salmon trout was surveyed—it was then figured—and the state engineer did the figuring that there was water enough on the Salmon, tract to irrigate 125,000 acres. That there was not is now admitted by all. After 75,000 acres had been sold, the sales stopped. It quickly became evident that the water supply would never irrigate the amount of land that settlers had purchased. Although the settlers had bought on the assurance of the state engineer, the commonwealth was not legally liable.

Then lawyers started. Had the settlers begun the action of A. E. Caldwell, et al, been able at the beginning to raise enough money to make all the parties in interest, that is, all the purchasers of land and all the assignees of these purchasers, parties defendant—the matter might have been speedily disposed of, but lacking this, the question of what amount of water should be delivered, the issue of maintenance fees and the issue in regard to liability for payment until the company delivered enough water were raised and the main point of difference was left untouched, except incidentally.

Under the administration of Governor M. Alexander the state and nation began to cooperate toward determining how much land could be sufficiently watered. Under his first administration a legislative committee made a majority and minority report. The majority estimated that the total amount would not exceed 20,000 acres. A minority report signed by Representative Andrew placed the figures at 35,000 acres. This was proven to be approximately correct by the careful surveys and estimations of the state and government engineers made in 1918, as substantiated in the celebrated Whiffen report, which showed the amount to be about 34,000 acres.

This report also recommended that certain lands be eliminated from the district. The result has been that our efforts have been made to adjust matters along this line. That the report itself was a masterpiece of engineering is pretty generally admitted. It has been made the basis of negotiations between the company and the settlers. The settlers who object to it mostly do so on the ground that certain provisions of the contract offered by the bondholders and company are unsatisfactory, either with reference to price or in regard to the character of title offered, or some other detail which they believe to be essential.

Although another suit is likely to be instituted, besides the one on which Judge Lee has ruled as to certain motions, the Salmon differences and litigation are drawing to a close and the Salmon tract promises to be one of the best agricultural regions in Idaho. Since Judge Lee has only sustained a demurrer and a certain part of the complaint, a amended complaint is likely to be filed. The fact that there is an unusual amount of water in the reservoir this year as in every year encouraging, but there will always be enough for the territory within the district mapped off by the Whiffen report, since what is carried over from flood years like the present will apply the deficiencies during dry periods.
