U.S. TREASURY FIRE WILL BE INVESTIGATED

This Is the Fifth Fire of Mysterious Origin in the National Capital Recently and the Second in the U. S. Treasury Department—Damage Is About \$100,000.

WASHINGTON, May 3.—Confidential investigation has been started by the treasury department to find out what caused the latest fire at the United States treasury early today and random damage estimated at from \$100,000 to \$150,000 was inflicted by treasury officials.

Secret service operatives will aid in the inquiry into the blaze, which was started in the treasury in recent months.

Fire Started by Oil Burner

Police believe the fire was started by a kerosene burner in the drafting room of the treasury, where oil cans used in the lighting of blue prints were stored.

A portion of the roof was destroyed.

Damage was estimated at \$100,000.

This is the fifth fire to break out in Washington recently.

Planned to Set High on Front of the Treasury Building.—An explosion occurred in a room where chemicals used in making treasury blueprints are stored. It was deemed necessary to move the building up.

SPiritualism AND SUICIDE

Several deaths have been reported in the name of Constance Doyle's progress through the counter-breaching the case of death, the comfort and beauty of the life beyond. The instinctive and early taught fear that keeps many people from taking their own lives has been removed, apparently, and with it the inhibitions have broken down. These suicides have believed that if the reports they read or heard of the eminent spiritualist's belief were true, there was no use in sticking out any longer their present suffering. All they can do is to reach joy to die.

Too much care cannot be taken in urging it upon that the spiritualistic teaching is directly opposite to life. For those who奉ent it, no explanation is needed. But for those who are taking it seriously, there should be no half-way learning of the lesson. All the spiritualists, all the Theosophists, as well as all the Christians and churches, teach that suicide is one of the greatest sins, and must be paid for. Constance Doyle teaches that the spirit of the suicide must go on suffering on the other side just as he did here, until the time when death would have occurred on this plane. He states definitely that there is an appointed time, and nothing is gained by hastening it, but on the contrary, much is lost.

Agencies which serve many people from outside in a year declare that there is usually a point in the development of the suicide where the person holding it can be turned to new hope or to sterner courage, and can be induced to hang on and make another start. A wider diffusion of this knowledge may help to keep some of these unfortunate from making the wrong turn.

Better Quality and Higher Prices the Object

Following the lead of producers in many other lines, the western producers of maple syrup are now pooling their interests through our local association.

According to a report of the New York State Maple Syrup Producers Association, similar action is being taken in the eastern states. Farmers have found their "sugar bushes" unprofitable of profit and their investments in them do not demand greater returns for their labor.

It is expected that through the action of the eastern producers of maple syrup and sugar the price will not be put up and that higher prices can be demanded on the market.

There will be no general charges for the forest, said a representative of the Los Angeles Produce Commission, and the western producers of the largest users of maple sugar and the rags in maple sugar prices are al-

ready affecting our sales. At first our maple sugar comes from Canada but the rest is produced in our own East, so we naturally are very much interested in the price of maple sugar.

Consequently, we are doing our best to keep our prices up, and every one knows the last of maple syrup.
