

Several of the churches went on record Sunday as being opposed to Sunday baseball in the city of Twin Falls and will send delegations to the board of education of our city schools tonight to protest against the use of the Lincoln Field for Sunday baseball.

If the farmers of this tract can supply a market for their products nearer home it will mean a great saving in the cost of marketing which is after all one of the big problems on the Twin Falls track. By raising more stock and feeding the products of the field, to that stock is one of the best methods to beat the high cost of transportation. Even then the privation of transportation will get a whack at you to market your stock but this will be much less than the cost of placing your crops on the railroad and shipping it several thousand miles to an eastern market.

The Junior Swine Breeders' association of Twin Falls county is a real live organization and will meet toward the solution of our problem in this country for diversified farming. The Times has been preaching this gospel for some time but the young men will present this in a more forceful fashion than we can and get the message direct to the source where the pressure should be applied. Human agencies are very essential to put these affairs over and the young men are applying this agency.

WHAT DO WE SEEK?

Good—Democracy—know what it seeks! The lazy way of compromise is a method by which the masses constantly determine what they know nothing about. It is as if all private contracts were decided by juries and did not hear the evidence and was not called by any court.

Democracy, as selected men planned, in the Constitution, gave the people's interest a break it down. Government by the people and intelligent prejudices threaten to take

democracy out to mean not the interference of masses in everything, but the opportunity, always, of the community to obtain the best machinery by which the public can control its servants without troubling them. It should reflect what wishes without deciding matters on which it ignoramus in complete.

LEST THEY FORGET AT GENOA

Figures just made public by a German military statistician give a partial answer to some of the protestations by the French delegates at Genoa. The German killed during the war was 1,805,656, or at the rate of 46 for every hour of the 51 months seven days, from beginning to armistice.

In the 43-month Russo war there were losses in killed, 1,700,000, or at a rate of 54 men every hour. Total losses in killed were 7,668,300, or at the rate of 207 men every hour, of which the Russians contributed 25 per cent.

Had not the Russians given up their lives in such a staggering ratio there would not be a France to throw her weighty and dominant power in the face of the delegates at Genoa. It might well favor the belligerent French, to remember that 300,000 more Russians were killed in 33 months than the French lost in more than 51 months. And those 1,700,000 Russian peasants, perishing miserably, thousands without arms, that France's life might be spared.

NEXT FALL'S ELECTION

The Republican record will be judged in November. It will be difficult, however, to select among the impulses that always move the voter.

In elections to the house public opinion (or public nerves) will be registered. If anybody can tell what is decided about foreign affairs, taxation, bonds, railroads, budget or tariff, send him around to this office. Sometimes, instead of elections by the ultimate, now on a hedge-hedge of topics we shall have elections on specific issues.

The most desirable result in November would be for the house to remain Republican, but by a rather small margin. A hulky majority like the present is undesirable, and so is the house Democratic, with the senate and the administration Republican, would be irrational and obstructive.

The senate will not greatly change. If Lodge says goodby, his vacant place may possibly enable the Republicans to develop somebody who can lead. There is not a great democratic question of the day on which Lodge has said a word with life in it.

In foreign affairs, also, he is important. When he only means was to chastise Wilson, a snake, as it is said, tried to follow the senator's chance of conviction and broke its back. Having no principles, no principles, he can not become the thing that man follows. Especially in times of heavy burdens like the present, a leader must stand not merely against things but also for things. He should be brave, and he should be going somewhere.—Hearns.
