WASHINGTON, May 22.—The administration has decided to let the question of recognition stand over until the election of a new government according to its instructions given to Senator Borah yesterday. The Senate will not be asked to recognize the new government unless the new government will either be rejected or it will be indicated that it has been recognized.

Through its spokesman, Senator Borah, the administration has indicated that it does not want to be responsible for recognizing a new government which it believes to be illegitimate.
